Anniversary as a Noun

Definitions of "Anniversary" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “anniversary” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The date on which a couple were married in a previous year.*
- *The date on which an event took place or an institution was founded in a previous year.*
- *The date on which an event occurred in some previous year (or the celebration of it).*
- *The date on which a romance began in a previous month or week.*



Synonyms of "Anniversary" as a noun (3 Words)

- commemoration** A ceremony or celebration in which a person or event is remembered.
Commemorations of wartime anniversaries.
- day of remembrance** An era of existence or influence.
- jubilee** A year of emancipation and restoration, kept every fifty years.
*To celebrate its **jubilee** the club is holding a tournament.*



Usage Examples of "Anniversary" as a noun

- *The 50th anniversary of the Battle of Britain.*
- *The 75th anniversary of the RAF.*
- *He even forgot our tenth anniversary!*



Associations of "Anniversary" (30 Words)

annually	By the year; every year (usually with reference to a sum of money paid or received). <i>They travel to China annually.</i>
banquet	Provide a feast or banquet for. <i>Ambassadors were fabulously banqueted and loaded with gifts.</i>
bicentennial	The 200th anniversary (or the celebration of it). <i>Bicentennial celebration.</i>
<u>birthday</u>	An anniversary of the day on which a person was born (or the celebration of it). <i>The seventy fifth birthday of the Institute.</i>
celebrate	Have a celebration. <i>The film director was celebrated all over Hollywood.</i>

celebration	The public performance of a sacrament or solemn ceremony with all appropriate ritual. <i>The birth of his son was a cause for celebration.</i>
celebratory	Feeling or expressing happiness and pride. <i>The impending anniversary has the restaurant in a celebratory mood.</i>
centenary	The 100th anniversary (or the celebration of it). <i>The society has just celebrated its centenary.</i>
centennial	A hundredth anniversary. <i>Centennial celebrations.</i>
ceremony	Formal polite behaviour. <i>He showed them to their table with great ceremony.</i>
<u>commemorate</u>	Celebrate by some ceremony or observation. <i>This sculpture commemorates the victims of the concentration camps.</i>
coronation	The ceremony of crowning a sovereign or a sovereign's consort. <i>The Queen s coronation.</i>
<u>feast</u>	Provide a feast or banquet for. <i>They feasted the deputation.</i>
<u>festival</u>	A day or period of celebration, typically for religious reasons. <i>A major international festival of song.</i>
<u>festive</u>	Relating to a festival, especially Christmas. <i>The sombre atmosphere has given way to a festive mood.</i>
fete	Have a celebration. <i>A church fete.</i>
gala	A gay festivity. <i>A gala performance by the Royal Ballet.</i>
<u>memorial</u>	Intended to commemorate someone or something. <i>A memorial service in the dead man s honour.</i>
memorialize	Preserve the memory of; commemorate. <i>The novel memorialized their childhood summers.</i>
parade	A parade ground. <i>She made a parade of her sorrows.</i>
perennially	In a perennial manner; repeatedly. <i>A lily that grows perennially from bulbs.</i>
plaque	(pathology) a small abnormal patch on or inside the body. <i>Plaque around gum margins can lead to gingivitis.</i>
potlatch	Hold a potlatch.

reminder	A letter sent to remind someone of an obligation, especially to pay a bill. <i>He ignored his wife s reminders.</i>
revelry	Lively and noisy festivities, especially when these involve drinking a large amount of alcohol. <i>Sounds of revelry issued into the night.</i>
semiannual	Occurring or payable twice each year.
tercentenary	The 300th anniversary (or the celebration of it). <i>His tercentenary year.</i>
triennial	A visitation of an Anglican diocese by its bishop every three years. <i>The triennial meeting of the Association.</i>
wedding	A party of people at a wedding.
yearly	Occurring or payable every year. <i>Yearly medical examinations.</i>
