
## Annotate as a Verb

#### Definitions of "Annotate" as a verb

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "annotate" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Add notes to (a text or diagram) giving explanation or comment.
- Add explanatory notes to or supply with critical comments.
- Provide interlinear explanations for words or phrases.





# Synonyms of "Annotate" as a verb (6 Words)

add footnotes to	Make an addition (to); join or combine or unite with others; increase the quality, quantity, size or scope of.
add notes to	State or say further.
comment	Make or write a comment on. She <b>comment</b> ed on the post with three heart emojis.
comment on	Make or write a comment on.
footnote	Add a footnote or footnotes to a piece of writing.
gloss	Give a shine or gloss to usually by rubbing. The pebble dash of the walls was <b>gloss</b> ed white.





## Usage Examples of "Annotate" as a verb

- The scholar annotated the early edition of a famous novel.
- He annotated on what his teacher had written.





# Associations of "Annotate" (30 Words)

<u>allusion</u>	The practice of making allusions. A classical <b>allusion</b> .
annotation	A note by way of explanation or comment added to a text or diagram. Marginal <b>annotation</b> s.
apostrophe	Address to an absent or imaginary person.
<u>article</u>	The definite or indefinite article. An <b>article</b> about middle aged executives.
<u>bibliography</u>	A list of writings with time and place of publication (such as the writings of a single author or the works referred to in preparing a document etc. <i>A bibliography of his publications.</i>
<u>book</u>	The notebook in which a referee writes the names of players who are cautioned for foul play. I didn t hear the verdict because I had to <b>book</b> it to work.



caret	A mark used by an author or editor to indicate where something is to be inserted into a text.
citation	A short note recognizing a source of information or of a quoted passage. <i>A traffic <b>citation</b>.</i>
<u>cite</u>	Praise (someone, typically a member of the armed forces) in an official report for a courageous act. <i>Medics have been cited as a key example of a modern breed of technical</i> <i>expert.</i>
comment	A written explanation or commentary. You asked for <b>comment</b> s on the new proposals.
<u>compile</u>	Convert (a program) into a machine-code or lower-level form in which the program can be executed. The local authority must <b>compile</b> a list of the names and addresses of taxpayers.
<u>descriptive</u>	Describing the structure of a language. <i>Descriptive</i> grammar.
<u>dictum</u>	A formal pronouncement from an authoritative source. <i>The old <b>dictum</b> might is right.</i>
<u>excerpt</u>	Take an excerpt or excerpts from a text. The notes are <b>excerpt</b> ed from his forthcoming biography.
<u>maxim</u>	English inventor (born in the United States) who invented the Maxim gun that was used in World War I (1840-1916. The <b>maxim</b> that actions speak louder than words.
mention	Make mention of. She made no <b>mention</b> of her disastrous trip to Paris.
motto	A favorite saying of a sect or political group. They were developing the use of leitmotifs or <b>motto</b> es that appear throughout an opera.
notation	A note or annotation. <i>He added a short <b>notation</b> to the address on the envelope.</i>
ostensive	Directly demonstrative.
<u>paraphrase</u>	Express the meaning of (something written or spoken) using different words, especially to achieve greater clarity. Scattered here and there in the text are frank <b>paraphrase</b> s of lines from Virgil Cicero and Quintilian.
quotation	A passage or expression that is quoted or cited. A great argument with much <b>quotation</b> of Darwin.



<u>quote</u>	A passage or expression that is quoted or cited. <i>Quote prices for cars.</i>
<u>refer</u>	Of a word phrase or symbol describe or denote have as a referent. This plant can be <b>refer</b> red to a known species.
reference	A publication (or a passage from a publication) that is referred to. <i>He carried an armful of <b>reference</b>s back to his desk.</i>
remark	Regard with attention; notice. Tom s looking peaky she <b>remark</b> ed.
sentence	Pronounce a sentence on somebody in a court of law. Her husband is serving a three year <b>sentence</b> for fraud.
statement	A presentation of a theme or melody within a composition. Children with <b>statement</b> s of special educational needs.
<u>text</u>	Send someone a text message. Pictures made the <b>text</b> easier to understand.
tin	Cover with a thin layer of tin. <i>Tin</i> ned foods are not very tasty.
typographic	Relating to or occurring or used in typography. A <b>typographic</b> al error.
