Definitions of "Annual" as a noun

- *(botany) a plant that completes its entire life cycle within the space of a year.*
- *A plant that completes its entire life cycle within the space of a year.*
- *A reference book that is published regularly once every year.*
- *An annual plant.*

yearbook A book published annually by the graduating class of a high school or college usually containing photographs of faculty and graduating students.

*The Rugby Union **Yearbook**.*

yearly A reference book that is published regularly once every year.

Annual as an Adjective

Definitions of "Annual" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “annual” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Occurring once every year.*
- *Completing its life cycle within a year.*
- *Calculated over or covering a period of a year.*
- *(of a plant) living only for a year or less, perpetuating itself by seed.*
- *Occurring or payable every year.*



Synonyms of "Annual" as an adjective (4 Words)

every twelve months Each and all of a series of entities or intervals as specified.

lasting a year Existing for a long time.

one-year Completing its life cycle within a year.

[yearly](#) Done, produced, or occurring once a year or every year.

Yearly *medical examinations.*

Associations of "Annual" (30 Words)

almanac	An annual publication containing tabular information in a particular field or fields arranged according to the calendar of a given year.
annually	Without missing a year. <i>They travel to China annually.</i>
<u>audit</u>	A methodical examination or review of a condition or situation. <i>Audits can't be expected to detect every fraud.</i>
<u>biannual</u>	Occurring or payable twice each year. <i>The biannual meeting of the planning committee.</i>
biennial	A plant having a life cycle that normally takes two seasons from germination to death to complete flowering biennials usually bloom and fruit in the second season. <i>Parsnips and carrots are biennial plants often grown as annuals.</i>
bimonthly	Twice a month. <i>Bimonthly visits.</i>

biweekly	Occurring every two weeks. <i>She followed her doctor's instructions to undergo health checks biweekly.</i>
celebration	The action of celebrating an important day or event. <i>A birthday celebration.</i>
cyclical	Occurring in cycles; recurrent. <i>The cyclical nature of the cement industry.</i>
daily	Of or belonging to or occurring every day. <i>Boats can be hired for a daily rate.</i>
day-to-day	United States writer best known for his autobiographical works (1874-1935).
deductible	Acceptable as a deduction (especially as a tax deduction). <i>Childcare vouchers will be deductible expenses for employers.</i>
diurnal	Of or during the day. <i>Diurnal aberration.</i>
inauguration	The formal admission of someone to office. <i>He opposed the inauguration of fluoridation.</i>
monthly	A periodical that is published every month (or 12 issues per year). <i>An Anglo American monthly whose appeal was always international.</i>
oft	Many times at short intervals. <i>An oft quoted tenet.</i>
perennial	A perennial plant. <i>Perennial manifestations of urban crisis.</i>
perennially	In a perennial manner; repeatedly. <i>A lily that grows perennially from bulbs.</i>
periodic	Relating to the periodic table of the elements. <i>The periodic appearance of the seventeen year locust.</i>
periodical	A publication that appears at fixed intervals. <i>She took periodical gulps of her tea.</i>
periodicity	The quality or character of being periodic; the tendency to recur at intervals. <i>The periodicity of the sunspot cycle.</i>
quarterly	A periodical that is published every quarter (or four issues per year). <i>Interest is paid quarterly.</i>
regular	A regular customer member of a team etc. <i>Her breathing became more regular.</i>
regularly	In a way that follows the normal pattern of inflection. <i>Regularly spaced buildings.</i>
semiannual	Occurring or payable twice each year.

tercentenary The three-hundredth anniversary of a significant event.
*Events arranged to mark the Library's **tercentenary**.*

triennial Lasting for or relating to a period of three years.
*The **triennial** meeting of the Association.*

weekly A periodical that is published every week (or 52 issues per year).
*A **weekly** visit.*

year A period similar to a year used for reckoning time according to other calendars.
*It's almost a **year** since his heart attack.*

yearly Done, produced, or occurring once a year or every year.
*Annual or **yearly** income.*
