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Associations of "Another word for sexy" (30 Words)

alphabet	The elementary stages of any subject (usually plural). <i>The first letter of the alphabet.</i>
antonym	A word that expresses a meaning opposed to the meaning of another word in which case the two words are antonyms of each other. <i>To him the antonym of gay was depressed.</i>
bilingual	(of a country, city, or other community) using two languages, especially officially. <i>Bilingual education.</i>
collocation	A grouping of words in a sentence. <i>The words have a similar range of collocation.</i>
derivation	The process whereby new words are formed from existing words or bases by affixation. <i>Music of primarily Turkish derivation.</i>
derivative	An arrangement or product (such as a future, option, or warrant) whose value derives from and is dependent on the value of an underlying asset, such as a commodity, currency, or security. <i>Equity based derivative products.</i>
dictionary	A set of words or other text strings made for use in applications such as spellcheckers. <i>The worm attempts to crack account passwords using a built in dictionary.</i>
diphthong	A digraph representing the sound of a diphthong or single vowel as in feat.
grammar	A book on grammar. <i>My old Latin grammar.</i>
grammarian	A linguist who specializes in the study of grammar and syntax.
homonym	Two words are homonyms if they are pronounced and spelled the same way but have different meanings.

interpreter	Someone who mediates between speakers of different languages. <i>She was famous as an interpreter of Shakespearean roles.</i>
language	Language communication by word of mouth. <i>A study of the way children learn language.</i>
lexicographer	A compiler or writer of a dictionary; a student of the lexical component of language.
lexicon	A reference book containing an alphabetical list of words with information about them. <i>The size of the English lexicon.</i>
meaning	Rich in significance or implication. <i>What is the meaning of this proverb.</i>
multilingual	Using or knowing more than one language. <i>A multilingual nation.</i>
noun	A word other than a pronoun used to identify any of a class of people places or things common noun or to name a particular one of these proper noun.
orthography	The conventional spelling system of a language. <i>A spoken language which has as yet no sanctioned orthography.</i>
paragraph	Arrange a piece of writing in paragraphs. <i>The concluding paragraph.</i>
philologist	A humanist specializing in classical scholarship.
phonetic	Relating to phonetics. <i>Phonetic training.</i>
pronunciation	The way in which a word is pronounced. <i>That is the correct pronunciation.</i>
sentence	Pronounce a sentence on somebody in a court of law. <i>Ten army officers were sentenced to life imprisonment.</i>
spelling	The process or activity of writing or naming the letters of a word. <i>The books and spelling in my class were too simple.</i>
term	Name formally or designate with a term. <i>A term of abuse.</i>
translator	A program that translates one programming language into another. <i>The translator of Hardy s poems into Icelandic.</i>
verb	Use a word that is not conventionally used as a verb typically a noun as a verb. <i>Any English noun can be verbed but some are more resistant than others.</i>

vocabulary A range of artistic or stylistic forms, techniques, or movements.
*He had a wide **vocabulary**.*

vowel A letter representing a vowel sound such as a e i o u.
