### Definitions of "Anthology" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “anthology” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A collection of songs or musical compositions issued in one album.*
- *A published collection of poems or other pieces of writing.*
- *A collection of selected literary passages.*

### Synonyms of "Anthology" as a noun (8 Words)

<b>collection</b>	A sum of money raised during a church or charity collection. <i>Refuse <b>collection</b>.</i>
<b>compendium</b>	A publication containing a variety of works. <i>A <b>compendium</b> of tools.</i>
<b>compilation</b>	The action or process of producing something, especially a list or book, by assembling information collected from other sources. <i>Great care has been taken in the <b>compilation</b> of this guidebook.</i>
<b><u>digest</u></b>	A substance or mixture obtained by digestion. <i>A <b>digest</b> of their findings.</i>

<b>miscellany</b>	A book containing a collection of pieces of writing by different authors. <i>A <b>miscellany</b> of houses.</i>
<b>pot-pourri</b>	A collection containing a variety of sorts of things.
<b>selection</b>	A plot of land acquired by selection. <i>The restaurant offers a wide <b>selection</b> of hot and cold dishes.</i>
<b>treasury</b>	A depository (a room or building) where wealth and precious objects can be kept safely. <i>The landowners estates and assets were seized for the imperial <b>treasury</b>.</i>

### Associations of "Anthology" (30 Words)

<b>author</b>	Be the author of. <i>I had to read <b>authors</b> I disliked.</i>
<b>bard</b>	Shakespeare. <i>Our national <b>bard</b> Robert Burns.</i>
<b>bestseller</b>	A book that has had a large and rapid sale. <i>The <b>bestseller</b> list.</i>
<b>epic</b>	The genre of epics. <i><b>Epic</b> tradition.</i>
<b>epigram</b>	A witty saying. <i>A Wildean <b>epigram</b>.</i>
<b>epistemology</b>	The theory of knowledge, especially with regard to its methods, validity, and scope, and the distinction between justified belief and opinion.
<b>fiction</b>	Literature in the form of prose that describes imaginary events and people. <i>The notion of the country being a democracy is a polite <b>fiction</b>.</i>
<b>literate</b>	A literate person. <i>Computer <b>literate</b>.</i>
<b>literature</b>	The humanistic study of a body of literature. <i>Her place in <b>literature</b> is secure.</i>
<b>minstrel</b>	Celebrate by singing in the style of minstrels. <i>They listened to the <b>minstrels</b> singing songs of knightly prowess.</i>

<u>narration</u>	A commentary delivered to accompany a film, broadcast, etc. <i>His <b>narration</b> was hesitant.</i>
<u>novel</u>	The literary genre represented or exemplified by novels. <i>He burned all the <b>novels</b>.</i>
<u>ode</u>	A classical poem of a kind originally meant to be sung.
<u>poem</u>	A piece of writing in which the expression of feelings and ideas is given intensity by particular attention to diction (sometimes involving rhyme), rhythm, and imagery. <i>The sun is an important symbol in this <b>poem</b>.</i>
<u>poesy</u>	The art or composition of poetry. <i>They were enamoured of <b>poesy</b> and the fine arts.</i>
<u>poetic</u>	Of or relating to poetry. <i>The muse is a <b>poetic</b> convention.</i>
<u>poetics</u>	The art of writing poetry. <i>The terminology of traditional <b>poetics</b>.</i>
<u>poetry</u>	Any communication resembling poetry in beauty or the evocation of feeling. <i>She glanced at the papers and saw some lines of <b>poetry</b>.</i>
<u>potboiler</u>	A book, film, or other creative work produced solely to make the originator a living by catering to popular taste.
<u>prose</u>	Compose in or convert into prose. <i>A short story in <b>prose</b>.</i>
<u>quatrain</u>	A stanza of four lines.
<u>read</u>	Having a specified level of knowledge as a result of reading. <i>I m <b>reading</b> English at Cambridge.</i>
<u>recite</u>	Recite in elocution. <i>She <b>recited</b> a poem.</i>
<u>rhapsody</u>	(in ancient Greece) an epic poem adapted for recitation. <i>Rhapsodies of praise.</i>
<u>rhyme</u>	Of a poem or song be composed in rhyme. <i>Hat and cat <b>rhyme</b>.</i>
<u>sonnet</u>	Compose sonnets. <i>He <b>sonneted</b> his hostess now.</i>
<u>stanza</u>	A group of four lines in some Greek and Latin metres.
<u>verse</u>	Speak in or compose verse versify. <i><b>Verse</b> drama.</i>
<u>write</u>	Write music. <i>If I could <b>write</b> the beauty of your eyes.</i>
