<b>anthropological</b>	Relating to the study of humankind. <i>An <b>anthropological</b> expedition to Borneo.</i>
<b>antiquity</b>	An object, building, or work of art from the ancient past. <i>A church of great <b>antiquity</b>.</i>
<b>archaeology</b>	The branch of anthropology that studies prehistoric people and their cultures.

<b>criminology</b>	The scientific study of crime and criminals.
<b>culture</b>	A preparation of cells obtained by culture. <i>The reason that the agency is doomed to inaction has something to do with the FBI <b>culture</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">early</a></b>	Of an early stage in the development of a language or literature. <i><b>Early</b> forms of life.</i>
<b>economics</b>	The condition of a region or group as regards material prosperity. <i>He is responsible for the island s modest <b>economics</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">era</a></b>	A measure of a pitcher s effectiveness calculated as the average number of earned runs allowed by the pitcher for every nine innings pitched. <i>Leading photographers of the Victorian <b>era</b>.</i>
<b>ethnic</b>	A person who is a member of an ethnic group. <i>The students <b>ethnic</b> backgrounds are very diverse.</i>
<b>ethnography</b>	The branch of anthropology that provides scientific description of individual human societies.

<b>ethnology</b>	The study of the characteristics of different peoples and the differences and relationships between them.
<b>folklore</b>	A body of popular myths or beliefs relating to a particular place, activity, or group of people. <i>Hollywood <b>folklore</b>.</i>
<b>geography</b>	The nature and relative arrangement of places and physical features. <i>The <b>geography</b> of post war London.</i>
<b>historical</b>	(of the study of a subject) based on an analysis of its development over a period. <i>The <b>historical</b> Jesus.</i>
<b>mankind</b>	Human beings considered collectively; the human race. <i>Research for the benefit of all <b>mankind</b>.</i>
<b>megalithic</b>	Massive or monolithic. <i>Massive <b>megalithic</b> monuments.</i>
<b>millennium</b>	A utopian period of justice, peace, and prosperity. <i>Archer's treatise predicted that the <b>millennium</b> was close at hand.</i>
<b>nationalism</b>	Love of country and willingness to sacrifice for it. <i>Their <b>nationalism</b> is tempered by a desire to join the European Union.</i>
<b>neolithic</b>	Of or relating to the most recent period of the Stone Age (following the mesolithic).
<b>paleolithic</b>	Second part of the Stone Age beginning about 750,000 to 500,000 years BC and lasting until the end of the last ice age about 8,500 years BC. <i><b>Paleolithic</b> artifacts.</i>
<b>paleontology</b>	The earth science that studies fossil organisms and related remains.
<b>past</b>	A verb tense that expresses actions or states in the past. <i>The band has changed over the <b>past</b> twelve months.</i>
<b>period</b>	The interval between successive equal values of a periodic function. <i>Ganoid fishes swarmed during the earlier geological <b>periods</b>.</i>
<b>prehistoric</b>	No longer fashionable. <i><b>Prehistoric</b> peoples.</i>
<b>prehistory</b>	The time during the development of human culture before the appearance of the written word. <i>The <b>prehistory</b> of capitalism.</i>
<b>sociology</b>	The study of the development, structure, and functioning of human society.

tradition

(in Christianity) doctrine not explicit in the Bible but held to derive from the oral teaching of Christ and the Apostles.

*Members of different castes have by **tradition** been associated with specific occupations.*
