Synonyms of "Antiquated" as an adjective (17 Words)

- anachronistic** Belonging or appropriate to an earlier period, especially so as to seem conspicuously old-fashioned.
*She is rebelling against the **anachronistic** morality of her parents.*
- ancient** Showing or feeling signs of age or wear.
***Ancient** history.*
- antediluvian** Of or belonging to the time before the biblical Flood.
***Antediluvian** man.*
- archaic** So extremely old as seeming to belong to an earlier period.
*Prisons are run on **archaic** methods.*
- behind the times** Having the lower score or lagging position in a contest.
Characteristic of the time of chivalry and knighthood in the Middle Ages.
- medieval** Without other people around I would let my flat degenerate into **medieval** levels of squalor.

obsolescent	Becoming obsolete. Obsolescent equipment.
obsolete	(of a part or characteristic of an organism) less developed than formerly or in a related species; rudimentary; vestigial. Obsolete words.
old-fashioned	Out of fashion.
out of date	Excluded from use or mention.
outdated	Old; no longer valid or fashionable. Outdated equipment.
outmoded	Old-fashioned. <i>Demode or outmoded attire.</i>
outworn	No longer usable or serviceable because of excessive wear. Outworn prejudices.
prehistoric	No longer fashionable. <i>My dad s electric typewriter was a prehistoric machine.</i>
primitive	(of a part or structure) in the first or early stage of formation or growth; rudimentary. <i>The accommodation at the camp was a bit primitive.</i>
quaint	Attractively unusual or old-fashioned. <i>Came forth a quaint and fearful sight.</i>
superannuated	Outdated or obsolete through age or new developments. <i>He left the house for the support of twelve superannuated wool carders.</i>

Associations of "Antiquated" (30 Words)

aging	Acquiring desirable qualities by being left undisturbed for some time.
anachronistic	Belonging to a period other than that being portrayed. <i>She is rebelling against the anachronistic morality of her parents.</i>
ancient	A person who lived in ancient times. <i>An ancient mariner.</i>
antediluvian	Of or belonging to the time before the biblical Flood. <i>They maintain antediluvian sex role stereotypes.</i>
antiquary	An expert or collector of antiquities.
antique	Make something resemble an antique by artificial means. <i>The kitchen had an antique cooker.</i>
antiquity	The historic period preceding the Middle Ages in Europe. <i>The great civilizations of antiquity.</i>

<u>archaic</u>	Little evolved from or characteristic of an earlier ancestral type. <i>Prisons are run on archaic methods.</i>
<u>battered</u>	Damaged by blows or hard usage. <i>A pair of battered black boots.</i>
<u>century</u>	A period of a hundred years reckoned from the traditional date of the birth of Christ. <i>He scored the only century of the tour.</i>
dilapidated	(of a building or object) in a state of disrepair or ruin as a result of age or neglect. <i>Old dilapidated buildings.</i>
<u>dowdy</u>	Primly out of date. <i>She could achieve the kind of casual chic which made every other woman around her look dowdy.</i>
<u>elder</u>	Used of the older of two persons of the same name especially used to distinguish a father from his son. <i>Schoolchildren were no less fascinated than their elders.</i>
elderly	(of a machine or similar object) showing signs of age. <i>Specialist services for the elderly.</i>
historical	(especially of a novel or film) set in the past. <i>A historical character.</i>
<u>moot</u>	Raise (a question or topic) for discussion; suggest (an idea or possibility). <i>The scheme was first mooted last October.</i>
obsolescent	Becoming obsolete. <i>Obsolescent slang.</i>
<u>obsolete</u>	Cause a product or idea to become obsolete by replacing it with something new. <i>The phrase was obsolete after 1625.</i>
old	Very familiar used for emphasis old adj skilled through long experience. <i>Good old boy.</i>
ossified	Having become rigid or fixed in attitude or position. <i>An ossified bureaucratic system.</i>
<u>outdated</u>	Old; no longer valid or fashionable. <i>Outdated equipment.</i>
paleolithic	Second part of the Stone Age beginning about 750,000 to 500,000 years BC and lasting until the end of the last ice age about 8,500 years BC. <i>Paleolithic artifacts.</i>

prehistory	The events or conditions leading up to a particular occurrence or phenomenon. <i>The prehistory of capitalism.</i>
senescence	The organic process of growing older and showing the effects of increasing age.
senescent	Growing old.
stodgy	Dull and uninspired; lacking originality or excitement. <i>A stodgy pudding served up when everyone was already full.</i>
stuffy	Affected with a sensation of stoppage or obstruction. <i>Inhaling vapour from a bowl of hot water may help to clear a stuffy nose.</i>
superannuated	Outdated or obsolete through age or new developments. <i>Superannuated laws.</i>
traditional	Existing in or as part of a tradition; long-established. <i>Traditional morality.</i>
yore	Time long past.
