According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "antiseptic" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Devoid of objectionable language.
- Scrupulously clean or pure, especially so as to be bland or characterless.

- Thoroughly clean and free of or destructive to disease-causing organisms.
