- *(in South Africa) a policy or system of segregation or discrimination on grounds of race.*
- *A social policy or racial segregation involving political and economic and legal discrimination against people who are not Whites; the former official policy in South Africa.*



Synonyms of "Apartheid" as a noun (9 Words)

- bias** Inclination or prejudice for or against one person or group, especially in a way considered to be unfair.
*The **bias** towards younger people in recruitment.*
- bigotry** The intolerance and prejudice of a bigot.
*The difficulties of combating prejudice and **bigotry**.*
- favouritism** Unfair treatment of a person or group on the basis of prejudice.
*The horse shares **favouritism** with her French trained rival at 6 1.*
- inequity** Injustice by virtue of not conforming with rules or standards.
*Policies aimed at redressing racial **inequity**.*
- intolerance** Unwillingness to accept views, beliefs, or behaviour that differ from one's own.
*His **intolerance** of interruptions.*
- narrow-mindedness** An inclination to criticize opposing opinions or shocking behavior.

| <u>discriminatory</u> | Making or showing an unjust or prejudicial distinction between different categories of people, especially on the grounds of ethnicity, sex, age, or disability. <i>A discriminatory tax.</i> |
| <u>elitist</u> | A person who believes that a society or system should be led by an elite. <i>Older men with an elitist attitude about music.</i> |
| equality | The state of being equal, especially in status, rights, or opportunities. <i>An organization aiming to promote racial equality.</i> |
| ethnography | The branch of anthropology that provides scientific description of individual human societies. |

| <u>silhouette</u> | Project on a background such as a screen like a silhouette. <i>We can always use a silhouette of Father Christmas.</i> |
