cool	Inducing the impression of coolness used especially of greens and blues and violets when referring to color. <b>Cool</b> to the idea of higher taxes.
detached	No longer connected or joined. On one side of the island was a hugh rock almost <b>detached</b> .
disinterested	Unaffected by self-interest. A banker is under an obligation to give <b>disinterested</b> advice.



dispassionate	Not influenced by strong emotion, and so able to be rational and impartial. <i>She dealt with life s disasters in a calm <b>dispassionate</b> way.</i>
emotionless	Unmoved by feeling-Margaret Deland. <i>He kept his <b>emotionless</b> objectivity and faith in the cause he served.</i>
half-hearted	Feeling or showing little interest or enthusiasm.
impassive	Deliberately impassive in manner. <i>He remained <b>impassive</b> showing neither interest in nor concern for our plight.</i>
indifferent	Neither good nor bad; mediocre. A gifted painter but an <b>indifferent</b> actor.
<u>lackadaisical</u>	Idle or indolent especially in a dreamy way. She was annoyingly <b>lackadaisical</b> and impractical.
lukewarm	Showing little enthusiasm. The film received a <b>lukewarm</b> reception from critics.
non-committal	Refusing to bind oneself to a particular course of action or view or the like.
<u>passive</u>	Accepting or allowing what happens or what others do, without active response or resistance. A <b>passive</b> optical network is to be installed in 2000 homes.
<u>uncaring</u>	Without care or thought for others. She had always been <b>uncaring</b> of her appearance.
<u>unconcerned</u>	Showing a lack of worry or interest, especially when this is surprising or callous. Scott seemed <b>unconcerned</b> by his companion s problem.
<u>unemotional</u>	Not having or showing strong feelings. A flat <b>unemotional</b> voice.
unfeeling	Devoid of feeling or sensation. <b>Unfeeling</b> trees.
uninterested	Not having or showing interest. I was totally <b>uninterested</b> in boys.
<u>uninvolved</u>	Showing lack of emotional involvement. Convicted killers in documentaries sound <b>uninvolved</b> and mechanical.
unmoved	Emotionally unmoved. Her opponents were <b>unmoved</b> and plan to return to court.
<u>unresponsive</u>	Aloof or indifferent. <i>These symptoms may be <b>unresponsive</b> to conventional treatment.</i>

# Associations of "Apathetic" (30 Words)

<u>blase</u>	Very sophisticated especially because of surfeit; versed in the ways of the world. <i>His</i> <b>blase</b> <i>indifference</i> .
bored	Feeling weary and impatient because one is unoccupied or lacks interest in one's current activity. <i>Strolled through the museum with a <b>bored</b> air.</i>
dispirited	Filled with melancholy and despondency. A <b>dispirited</b> and divided Party.
<u>drowsy</u>	Showing lack of attention or boredom. A <b>drowsy</b> suburb called Surrey Hills.
ennui	The feeling of being bored by something tedious. <i>He succumbed to <b>ennui</b> and despair.</i>
exhausted	Drained of energy or effectiveness extremely tired completely exhausted. <i>Kirov spat his patience suddenly</i> <b>exhausted</b> .
<u>feeble</u>	Lacking strength. Feeble efforts.
indifferent	Having no particular interest or sympathy; unconcerned. <i>The universe is neither hostile nor friendly it is simply</i> <b>indifferent</b> .
insouciant	Showing a casual lack of concern. An elegantly <b>insouciant</b> manner.
lackadaisical	Lacking enthusiasm and determination; carelessly lazy. She was annoyingly <b>lackadaisical</b> and impractical.
<u>languid</u>	Lacking spirit or liveliness. His <b>languid</b> demeanour irritated her.
languor	Tiredness or inactivity, especially when pleasurable. The afternoon was hot quiet and heavy with <b>languor</b> .
<u>lethargic</u>	Deficient in alertness or activity. I felt tired and a little <b>lethargic</b> .



<u>limp</u>	A tendency to limp a gait impeded by injury or stiffness. The accident left him with a pronounced <b>limp</b> .
<u>listless</u>	(of a person or their manner) lacking energy or enthusiasm. <i>Reacted to the crisis with listless resignation.</i>
<u>philosopher</u>	A person engaged or learned in philosophy, especially as an academic discipline.
prolixity	Boring verbosity.
<u>regardless</u>	(usually followed by `of') without due thought or consideration. The allowance is paid <b>regardless</b> of age or income.
rouse	Cause to be agitated excited or roused. His evasiveness <b>rouse</b> d my curiosity.
<u>sleepy</u>	Ready to fall asleep. A <b>sleepy</b> eyed child with drooping eyelids.
somnolence	A very sleepy state.
somnolent	Causing or suggestive of drowsiness. The sound had a <b>somnolent</b> effect.
<u>stoic</u>	Seeming unaffected by pleasure or pain; impassive. A look of <b>stoic</b> resignation.
tire	Exhaust or get tired through overuse or great strain or stress. I m so <b>tire</b> d of your mother and her complaints about my food.
tired	Bored or impatient with. <i>Too <b>tired</b> to eat.</i>
unconcerned	Lacking in interest or care or feeling. Readers <b>unconcerned</b> with style.
uninterested	Not interested in or concerned about something or someone. An <b>uninterested</b> voice.
unmolested	Not interfered with, disturbed, or harmed. <i>They allowed him to pass <b>unmolested</b></i> .
untroubled	Not feeling, showing, or affected by anxiety or problems. Seemed <b>untroubled</b> by doubts of any kind.
<u>weary</u>	Physically and mentally fatigued. A <b>weary</b> is archaic.
