lukewarm Showing little enthusiasm.

The film received a **lukewarm** reception from critics.

non-committal Refusing to bind oneself to a particular course of action or view or the

like.

Accepting or allowing what happens or what others do, without active

passive response or resistance.

A **passive** optical network is to be installed in 2000 homes.

Without care or thought for others.

She had always been **uncaring** of her appearance.

Showing a lack of worry or interest, especially when this is surprising or

unconcerned callous.

Scott seemed **unconcerned** by his companion s problem.

Not having or showing strong feelings.

unemotional A flat unemotional voice.

unfeeling Devoid of feeling or sensation.

uninterested Not having or showing interest.

I was totally **uninterested** in boys.

uninvolved Showing lack of emotional involvement.

Convicted killers in documentaries sound **uninvolved** and mechanical.

Emotionally unmoved.

Her opponents were **unmoved** and plan to return to court.

unresponsive Aloof or indifferent.

These symptoms may be **unresponsive** to conventional treatment.

lethargic Deficient in alertness or activity.
