Synonyms of "Apathetic" as an adjective (20 Words)

cool	Inducing the impression of coolness used especially of greens and blues and violets when referring to color. <i>Cool to the idea of higher taxes.</i>
detached	No longer connected or joined. <i>On one side of the island was a hugh rock almost detached.</i>
disinterested	Unaffected by self-interest. <i>A banker is under an obligation to give disinterested advice.</i>

dispassionate	Not influenced by strong emotion, and so able to be rational and impartial. <i>She dealt with life's disasters in a calm dispassionate way.</i>
emotionless	Unmoved by feeling-Margaret Deland. <i>He kept his emotionless objectivity and faith in the cause he served.</i>
half-hearted	Feeling or showing little interest or enthusiasm.
impassive	Deliberately impassive in manner. <i>He remained impassive showing neither interest in nor concern for our plight.</i>
indifferent	Neither good nor bad; mediocre. <i>A gifted painter but an indifferent actor.</i>
lackadaisical	Idle or indolent especially in a dreamy way. <i>She was annoyingly lackadaisical and impractical.</i>
lukewarm	Showing little enthusiasm. <i>The film received a lukewarm reception from critics.</i>
non-committal	Refusing to bind oneself to a particular course of action or view or the like.
passive	Accepting or allowing what happens or what others do, without active response or resistance. <i>A passive optical network is to be installed in 2000 homes.</i>
uncaring	Without care or thought for others. <i>She had always been uncaring of her appearance.</i>
unconcerned	Showing a lack of worry or interest, especially when this is surprising or callous. <i>Scott seemed unconcerned by his companion's problem.</i>
unemotional	Not having or showing strong feelings. <i>A flat unemotional voice.</i>
unfeeling	Devoid of feeling or sensation. <i>Unfeeling trees.</i>
uninterested	Not having or showing interest. <i>I was totally uninterested in boys.</i>
uninvolved	Showing lack of emotional involvement. <i>Convicted killers in documentaries sound uninvolved and mechanical.</i>
unmoved	Emotionally unmoved. <i>Her opponents were unmoved and plan to return to court.</i>
unresponsive	Aloof or indifferent. <i>These symptoms may be unresponsive to conventional treatment.</i>

<u>blase</u>	Very sophisticated especially because of surfeit; versed in the ways of the world. <i>His blase indifference.</i>
bored	Feeling weary and impatient because one is unoccupied or lacks interest in one's current activity. <i>Strolled through the museum with a bored air.</i>
dispirited	Filled with melancholy and despondency. <i>A dispirited and divided Party.</i>
<u>drowsy</u>	Showing lack of attention or boredom. <i>A drowsy suburb called Surrey Hills.</i>
ennui	The feeling of being bored by something tedious. <i>He succumbed to ennui and despair.</i>
exhausted	Drained of energy or effectiveness extremely tired completely exhausted. <i>Kirov spat his patience suddenly exhausted.</i>
<u>feeble</u>	Lacking strength. <i>Feeble efforts.</i>
indifferent	Having no particular interest or sympathy; unconcerned. <i>The universe is neither hostile nor friendly it is simply indifferent.</i>
insouciant	Showing a casual lack of concern. <i>An elegantly insouciant manner.</i>
<u>lackadaisical</u>	Lacking enthusiasm and determination; carelessly lazy. <i>She was annoyingly lackadaisical and impractical.</i>
<u>languid</u>	Lacking spirit or liveliness. <i>His languid demeanour irritated her.</i>
languor	Tiredness or inactivity, especially when pleasurable. <i>The afternoon was hot quiet and heavy with languor.</i>
<u>lethargic</u>	Deficient in alertness or activity. <i>I felt tired and a little lethargic.</i>

limp	A tendency to limp a gait impeded by injury or stiffness. <i>The accident left him with a pronounced limp.</i>
listless	(of a person or their manner) lacking energy or enthusiasm. <i>Reacted to the crisis with listless resignation.</i>
philosopher	A person engaged or learned in philosophy, especially as an academic discipline.
prolixity	Boring verbosity.
regardless	(usually followed by `of') without due thought or consideration. <i>The allowance is paid regardless of age or income.</i>
rouse	Cause to be agitated excited or roused. <i>His evasiveness roused my curiosity.</i>
sleepy	Ready to fall asleep. <i>A sleepy eyed child with drooping eyelids.</i>
somnolence	A very sleepy state.
somnolent	Causing or suggestive of drowsiness. <i>The sound had a somnolent effect.</i>
stoic	Seeming unaffected by pleasure or pain; impassive. <i>A look of stoic resignation.</i>
tire	Exhaust or get tired through overuse or great strain or stress. <i>I m so tired of your mother and her complaints about my food.</i>
tired	Bored or impatient with. <i>Too tired to eat.</i>
unconcerned	Lacking in interest or care or feeling. <i>Readers unconcerned with style.</i>
uninterested	Not interested in or concerned about something or someone. <i>An uninterested voice.</i>
unmolested	Not interfered with, disturbed, or harmed. <i>They allowed him to pass unmolested.</i>
untroubled	Not feeling, showing, or affected by anxiety or problems. <i>Seemed untroubled by doubts of any kind.</i>
weary	Physically and mentally fatigued. <i>Aweary is archaic.</i>
