- *Showing or feeling no interest, enthusiasm, or concern.*

### Synonyms of "Apathetic" as an adjective (20 Words)

<b>cool</b>	Inducing the impression of coolness used especially of greens and blues and violets when referring to color. <b>Cool</b> to the idea of higher taxes.
<b>detached</b>	No longer connected or joined. On one side of the island was a huge rock almost <b>detached</b> .
<b>disinterested</b>	Unaffected by self-interest. A banker is under an obligation to give <b>disinterested</b> advice.

<b>dispassionate</b>	Not influenced by strong emotion, and so able to be rational and impartial. <i>She dealt with life's disasters in a calm <b>dispassionate</b> way.</i>
<b>emotionless</b>	Unmoved by feeling-Margaret Deland. <i>He kept his <b>emotionless</b> objectivity and faith in the cause he served.</i>
<b>half-hearted</b>	Feeling or showing little interest or enthusiasm.
<b>impassive</b>	Deliberately impassive in manner. <i>He remained <b>impassive</b> showing neither interest in nor concern for our plight.</i>
<b>indifferent</b>	Neither good nor bad; mediocre. <i>A gifted painter but an <b>indifferent</b> actor.</i>
<b>lackadaisical</b>	Idle or indolent especially in a dreamy way. <i>She was annoyingly <b>lackadaisical</b> and impractical.</i>
<b>lukewarm</b>	Showing little enthusiasm. <i>The film received a <b>lukewarm</b> reception from critics.</i>
<b>non-committal</b>	Refusing to bind oneself to a particular course of action or view or the like.
<b>passive</b>	Accepting or allowing what happens or what others do, without active response or resistance. <i>A <b>passive</b> optical network is to be installed in 2000 homes.</i>
<b>uncaring</b>	Without care or thought for others. <i>She had always been <b>uncaring</b> of her appearance.</i>
<b>unconcerned</b>	Showing a lack of worry or interest, especially when this is surprising or callous. <i>Scott seemed <b>unconcerned</b> by his companion's problem.</i>
<b>unemotional</b>	Not having or showing strong feelings. <i>A flat <b>unemotional</b> voice.</i>
<b>unfeeling</b>	Devoid of feeling or sensation. <i><b>Unfeeling</b> trees.</i>
<b>uninterested</b>	Not having or showing interest. <i>I was totally <b>uninterested</b> in boys.</i>
<b>uninvolved</b>	Showing lack of emotional involvement. <i>Convicted killers in documentaries sound <b>uninvolved</b> and mechanical.</i>
<b>unmoved</b>	Emotionally unmoved. <i>Her opponents were <b>unmoved</b> and plan to return to court.</i>
<b>unresponsive</b>	Aloof or indifferent. <i>These symptoms may be <b>unresponsive</b> to conventional treatment.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Apathetic" as an adjective

- An apathetic electorate.

## Associations of "Apathetic" (30 Words)

<b><u>blase</u></b>	Very sophisticated especially because of surfeit; versed in the ways of the world. <i>His <b>blase</b> indifference.</i>
<b>bored</b>	Feeling weary and impatient because one is unoccupied or lacks interest in one's current activity. <i>Strolled through the museum with a <b>bored</b> air.</i>
<b>dispirited</b>	Filled with melancholy and despondency. <i>A <b>dispirited</b> and divided Party.</i>
<b><u>drowsy</u></b>	Showing lack of attention or boredom. <i>A <b>drowsy</b> suburb called Surrey Hills.</i>
<b>ennui</b>	The feeling of being bored by something tedious. <i>He succumbed to <b>ennui</b> and despair.</i>
<b>exhausted</b>	Drained of energy or effectiveness extremely tired completely exhausted. <i>Kirov spat his patience suddenly <b>exhausted</b>.</i>
<b><u>feeble</u></b>	Lacking strength. <i><b>Feeble</b> efforts.</i>
<b>indifferent</b>	Having no particular interest or sympathy; unconcerned. <i>The universe is neither hostile nor friendly it is simply <b>indifferent</b>.</i>
<b>insouciant</b>	Showing a casual lack of concern. <i>An elegantly <b>insouciant</b> manner.</i>
<b><u>lackadaisical</u></b>	Lacking enthusiasm and determination; carelessly lazy. <i>She was annoyingly <b>lackadaisical</b> and impractical.</i>
<b><u>languid</u></b>	Lacking spirit or liveliness. <i>His <b>languid</b> demeanour irritated her.</i>
<b>languor</b>	Tiredness or inactivity, especially when pleasurable. <i>The afternoon was hot quiet and heavy with <b>languor</b>.</i>
<b><u>lethargic</u></b>	Deficient in alertness or activity. <i>I felt tired and a little <b>lethargic</b>.</i>

<b><u>limp</u></b>	A tendency to limp a gait impeded by injury or stiffness. <i>The accident left him with a pronounced <b>limp</b>.</i>
<b><u>listless</u></b>	(of a person or their manner) lacking energy or enthusiasm. <i>Reacted to the crisis with <b>listless</b> resignation.</i>
<b><u>philosopher</u></b>	A person engaged or learned in philosophy, especially as an academic discipline.
<b>prolixity</b>	Boring verbosity.
<b><u>regardless</u></b>	(usually followed by `of') without due thought or consideration. <i>The allowance is paid <b>regardless</b> of age or income.</i>
<b>rouse</b>	Cause to be agitated excited or roused. <i>His evasiveness <b>roused</b> my curiosity.</i>
<b><u>sleepy</u></b>	Ready to fall asleep. <i>A <b>sleepy</b> eyed child with drooping eyelids.</i>
<b>somnolence</b>	A very sleepy state.
<b>somnolent</b>	Causing or suggestive of drowsiness. <i>The sound had a <b>somnolent</b> effect.</i>
<b><u>stoic</u></b>	Seeming unaffected by pleasure or pain; impassive. <i>A look of <b>stoic</b> resignation.</i>
<b>tire</b>	Exhaust or get tired through overuse or great strain or stress. <i>I m so <b>tired</b> of your mother and her complaints about my food.</i>
<b>tired</b>	Bored or impatient with. <i>Too <b>tired</b> to eat.</i>
<b><u>unconcerned</u></b>	Lacking in interest or care or feeling. <i>Readers <b>unconcerned</b> with style.</i>
<b>uninterested</b>	Not interested in or concerned about something or someone. <i>An <b>uninterested</b> voice.</i>
<b>unmolested</b>	Not interfered with, disturbed, or harmed. <i>They allowed him to pass <b>unmolested</b>.</i>
<b>untroubled</b>	Not feeling, showing, or affected by anxiety or problems. <i>Seemed <b>untroubled</b> by doubts of any kind.</i>
<b><u>weary</u></b>	Physically and mentally fatigued. <i>A<b>weary</b> is archaic.</i>
