ghastly Extremely unwell.

Ghastly shrieks.

grisly Causing horror or disgust.

The town was shaken by a series of **grisly** crimes.

gruesome Extremely unpleasant.

Gruesome catering.

harrowing Acutely distressing.

A **harrowing** film about racism and violence.

hateful Characterized by malice.

That **hateful** arrogant woman.

heinous (of a person or wrongful act, especially a crime) utterly odious or wicked.

A battery of **heinous** crimes.

hideous Extremely unpleasant.

A **hideous** pattern of injustice.

(informal to emphasize how bad it is) beyond hope of management or

hopeless reform.

With a **hopeless** sigh he sat down.

horrendous Extremely unpleasant, horrifying, or terrible.

Horrendous explosions shook the city.

horrible Provoking horror- Winston Churchill.

A **horrible** massacre.

horrific Causing fear or dread or terror.

Horrific injuries.

Provoking horror.

Substandard housing.

Very unwell or troubled. terrible

The stranger gave a **terrible** smile.

Not excusable. unforgivable

Losing your temper with him was **unforgivable**.

Not admitting of pardon.

Not satisfactory; not good enough.

unsatisfactory Years of living in **unsatisfactory** rented accommodation.

Causing or able to cause nausea. *He has a vile temper.*

Not attractive; ugly. unlovely
