## Apparently as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Apparently" as an adverb

- *From appearances alone.*
- *As far as one knows or can see.*
- *From appearances alone-Thomas.*
- *Unmistakably ( `plain' is often used informally for `plainly).*
- *Unmistakably ( `plain' is often used informally for `plainly).*



## Synonyms of "Apparently" as an adverb (11 Words)

**as far as one knows** To the same degree (often followed by `as.

**by all accounts** So as to pass a given point.

**evidently**

Unmistakably (`plain' is often used informally for `plainly.  
*She was in bed and **evidently** in great pain.*

**manifestly**

Unmistakably (`plain' is often used informally for `plainly.  
*The system was **manifestly** unfair.*

**obviously**

In a way that is easily perceived or understood; clearly.  
*She was **obviously** unwell.*

**ostensibly**

As appears or is stated to be true, though not necessarily so; apparently.  
*The party secretary resigned **ostensibly** from ill health.*

**patently**

Clearly; without doubt.  
*The Government's approach had **patently** failed to address the problem.*

<b>plain</b>	Unmistakably plain is often used informally for plainly. <i>He is <b>plain</b> stubborn.</i>
<b>plainly</b>	Unmistakably plain is often used informally for plainly. <i>To speak <b>plainly</b> I suffer from a lack of confidence.</i>
<b>seemingly</b>	From appearances alone. <i>The child is <b>seemingly</b> healthy but the doctor is concerned.</i>
<b>so it seems</b>	To a certain unspecified extent or degree.



## Usage Examples of "Apparently" as an adverb

- *I thought he owned the property, but apparently not.*
- *She has apparently been living here for some time.*
- *The child nodded, apparently content with the promise.*
- *Irrigation often produces bumper crops from apparently desert land.*



## Associations of "Apparently" (30 Words)

- apparent** Seeming real or true, but not necessarily so.  
*His **apparent** lack of concern.*
- assuredly** Confidently.  
*The lad kept his cool and **assuredly** slipped the ball between the posts.*
- certainly** Used to emphasize the speaker's belief that what is said is true.  
*Our current revenues are **certainly** lower than anticipated.*
- clearly** In an easily perceptible manner.  
*Could be seen **clearly** under the microscope.*
- conspicuous** Without any attempt at concealment; completely obvious.  
*He was very thin with a **conspicuous** Adam's apple.*

<b>detectable</b>	Able to be perceived or noticed; discernible. <i>Yvette responded finally her French accent barely <b>detectable</b>.</i>
<b>discernible</b>	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>An essay with a meaning that was not always <b>discernible</b>.</i>
<b>distinctly</b>	In a way that is readily distinguishable by the senses; clearly. <i>It s <b>distinctly</b> possible.</i>
<b>effortless</b>	Not showing effort or strain. <i>The swallows glided in an <b>effortless</b> way through the busy air.</i>
<b>evident</b>	Clearly seen or understood; obvious. <i>A clearly <b>evident</b> erasure in the manuscript.</i>
<b>evidently</b>	Used as an affirmative response. <i>A work so <b>evidently</b> laden with significance.</i>
<b>expressly</b>	Explicitly; clearly. <i>The house was <b>expressly</b> built for entertaining.</i>
<b>identifiable</b>	Able to be recognized; distinguishable. <i>There are no easily <b>identifiable</b> features on the shoreline.</i>
<b>indubitably</b>	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. <i>It was immediately and <b>indubitably</b> apparent that I had interrupted a scene of lovers.</i>
<b>justified</b>	Having, done for, or marked by a good or legitimate reason. <i>The doctors were <b>justified</b> in treating her.</i>
<b>manifest</b>	Record in a ship s manifest. <i>Each passenger must be <b>manifested</b>.</i>
<b>marked</b>	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>A <b>marked</b> increase in UK sales.</i>
<b>noticeable</b>	Undesirably noticeable. <i>The church is <b>noticeable</b> for the fresco above the door.</i>
<b>observable</b>	Able to be noticed or perceived; discernible. <i><b>Observable</b> differences.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Easily perceived or understood; clear, self-evident, or apparent. <i>Unemployment has been the most <b>obvious</b> cost of the recession.</i>
<b>obviously</b>	Unmistakably (`plain' is often used informally for `plainly). <i><b>Obviously</b> everyone has to do what they think is right.</i>
<b>palpability</b>	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
<b>palpable</b>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>There was a <b>palpable</b> sense of joy in the air.</i>

- perceptible** Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind.  
*A **perceptible** decline in public confidence.*
- plain** Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness.  
*There were indrawn breaths at such **plain** speaking.*
- positively** With certainty; so as to leave no room for doubt.  
*The negotiations started **positively** with agreement on several issues.*
- rightly** With good reason.  
*The key **rightly** belonged to Craig.*
- seemingly** From appearances alone-Thomas.  
*It s touch and go **seemingly** and she s asking for you.*
- surely** Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely.  
*No one knows how to move the economy quickly and **surely** in that direction.*
- visible** Visible imports or exports.  
*A highly **visible** member of the royal entourage.*
