The child is **seemingly** healthy but the doctor is concerned.


**so it seems** To a certain unspecified extent or degree.

**indubitably** It was immediately and **indubitably** apparent that I had interrupted a scene

of lovers.

**justified** Having, done for, or marked by a good or legitimate reason.

The doctors were **justified** in treating her.
