answering	Replying. <i>An answering smile.</i>
claimant	A person making a claim, especially in a lawsuit or for a state benefit. <i>One in four eligible claimants failed to register for a rebate.</i>
court	A room in which a lawcourt sits. <i>The map showed the crescents and courts of recent urban sprawl.</i>
courtroom	The place or room in which a court of law meets. <i>Television cameras were admitted in the courtroom.</i>
<u>defendant</u>	An individual, company, or institution sued or accused in a court of law. <i>The defendant tried to claim that it was self defence.</i>
docket	Place on the docket for legal action. <i>The clothes would be handed in and neatly docketed.</i>
garnishment	A court order directing that money or property of a third party (usually wages paid by an employer) be seized to satisfy a debt owed by a debtor to a plaintiff creditor.
<u>infraction</u>	A violation or infringement of a law or agreement.
infringement	The action of limiting or undermining something. <i>Copyright infringement.</i>
inquisition	A period of prolonged and intensive questioning. <i>She relented in her determined inquisition and offered help.</i>
judicature	An assembly (including one or more judges) to conduct judicial business. <i>The constitutional principle that the legislature is separate from the judicature.</i>
judicial	Of, by, or appropriate to a law court or judge; relating to the administration of justice. <i>A judicial system.</i>
jurisdiction	(law) the right and power to interpret and apply the law. <i>In some jurisdictions there is a mandatory death sentence for murder.</i>
lawsuit	A claim or dispute brought to a law court for adjudication. <i>His lawyer filed a lawsuit against Los Angeles city.</i>
<u>liable</u>	Subject to legal action. <i>The credit card company is liable for any breach of contract.</i>
litigant	Involved in a lawsuit. <i>The parties litigant.</i>
litigate	Take (a claim or a dispute) to a law court. <i>The plaintiff is prepared to litigate.</i>

plaintiff	A person who brings a case against another in a court of law. <i>The plaintiff commenced an action for damages.</i>
poll	Cut off the top of a tree or plant typically to encourage further growth pollard. <i>The ruling party won 24 seats narrowly topping the poll.</i>
proceeding	The institution of a sequence of steps by which legal judgments are invoked.
prosecution	The institution and conducting of legal proceedings against someone in respect of a criminal charge. <i>The BBC s prosecution of its commercial ends.</i>
respondent	The codefendant especially in a divorce proceeding who is accused of adultery with the corespondent. <i>Most respondents to our questionnaire considered their practices to be in accordance with current medical guidelines.</i>
rightful	Legally valid. <i>A rightful inheritance.</i>
sue	Institute legal proceedings against (a person or institution), typically for redress. <i>I sued for breach of contract.</i>
<u>survey</u>	A department carrying out the surveying of land. <i>The author provides a survey of the relevant literature.</i>
tribunal	An assembly (including one or more judges) to conduct judicial business. <i>An industrial tribunal ruled that he was unfairly dismissed.</i>
