## Associations of "Appendages" (30 Words)

<b>accessory</b>	Someone who gives assistance to the perpetrator of a crime without taking part in it. <i>Functionally the maxillae are a pair of <b>accessory</b> jaws.</i>
<b>additional</b>	Added, extra, or supplementary to what is already present or available. <i>We require <b>additional</b> information.</i>
<b><u>apparently</u></b>	From appearances alone. <i>I thought he owned the property but <b>apparently</b> not.</i>
<b>classifiable</b>	Capable of being classified.
<b>clearly</b>	Without doubt; obviously. <i>Could be seen <b>clearly</b> under the microscope.</i>
<b>confirming</b>	Serving to support or corroborate.
<b><u>conspicuous</u></b>	Attracting notice or attention. <i>He showed <b>conspicuous</b> bravery.</i>
<b>defined</b>	Showing clearly the outline or profile or boundary. <i>A number of clearly <b>defined</b> aims.</i>
<b>differentiated</b>	Exhibiting biological specialization; adapted during development to a specific function or environment.
<b><u>discrete</u></b>	Individually separate and distinct. <i>Speech sounds are produced as a continuous sound signal rather than <b>discrete</b> units.</i>
<b>distinct</b>	Recognizably different in nature from something else of a similar type. <i>A <b>distinct</b> flavor.</i>
<b>distinctly</b>	Clear to the mind; with distinct mental discernment. <i>He looked <b>distinctly</b> uncomfortable.</i>
<b><u>distinguish</u></b>	Identify as in botany or biology, for example. <i>We must <b>distinguish</b> between two kinds of holiday.</i>
<b>epithelial</b>	Relating to or denoting the thin tissue forming the outer layer of a body's surface and lining the alimentary canal and other hollow structures. <i>Ovarian <b>epithelial</b> tumours.</i>
<b><u>evident</u></b>	Clearly seen or understood; obvious. <i>She ate the biscuits with <b>evident</b> enjoyment.</i>
<b>expressly</b>	Explicitly; clearly. <i>She was <b>expressly</b> forbidden to use the stove.</i>
<b>identifiable</b>	Able to be recognized; distinguishable. <i>There are no easily <b>identifiable</b> features on the shoreline.</i>

<b>marked</b>	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>A scar <b>marked</b> face.</i>
<b><u>noticeable</u></b>	Undesirably noticeable. <i><b>Noticeable</b> shadows under her eyes.</i>
<b>noticeably</b>	In a way that is easily seen or noticed; clearly. <i>After surgery she deteriorated <b>noticeably</b>.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>It was <b>obvious</b> a storm was coming in.</i>
<b>obviously</b>	Unmistakably (‘plain’ is often used informally for ‘plainly’). <i><b>Obviously</b> everyone has to do what they think is right.</i>
<b>pronounced</b>	Very noticeable or marked; conspicuous. <i>He had a <b>pronounced</b> squint.</i>
<b><u>recognizable</u></b>	Easily perceived; easy to become aware of. <i>His car was instantly <b>recognizable</b>.</i>
<b><u>seemingly</u></b>	From appearances alone-Thomas. <i>A <b>seemingly</b> competent and well organized person.</i>
<b><u>specialized</u></b>	Requiring or involving detailed and specific knowledge or training. <i><b>Specialized</b> software.</i>
<b><u>specifically</u></b>	In distinction from others. <i>Some collectors maintain spaces <b>specifically</b> to house their larger works of art.</i>
<b><u>unambiguous</u></b>	Having or exhibiting a single clearly defined meaning. <i>Instructions should be <b>unambiguous</b>.</i>
<b><u>unlike</u></b>	Marked by dissimilarity. <i>They seemed utterly <b>unlike</b> despite being twins.</i>
<b>visibly</b>	In a visible manner. <i>She stretched out a <b>visibly</b> shaking hand.</i>
