Associations of "Appendages" (30 Words)

accessory	Someone who gives assistance to the perpetrator of a crime without taking part in it. <i>Functionally the maxillae are a pair of accessory jaws.</i>
additional	Added, extra, or supplementary to what is already present or available. <i>We require additional information.</i>
<u>apparently</u>	From appearances alone. <i>I thought he owned the property but apparently not.</i>
classifiable	Capable of being classified.
clearly	Without doubt; obviously. <i>Could be seen clearly under the microscope.</i>
confirming	Serving to support or corroborate.
<u>conspicuous</u>	Attracting notice or attention. <i>He showed conspicuous bravery.</i>
defined	Showing clearly the outline or profile or boundary. <i>A number of clearly defined aims.</i>
differentiated	Exhibiting biological specialization; adapted during development to a specific function or environment.
<u>discrete</u>	Individually separate and distinct. <i>Speech sounds are produced as a continuous sound signal rather than discrete units.</i>
distinct	Recognizably different in nature from something else of a similar type. <i>A distinct flavor.</i>
distinctly	Clear to the mind; with distinct mental discernment. <i>He looked distinctly uncomfortable.</i>
<u>distinguish</u>	Identify as in botany or biology, for example. <i>We must distinguish between two kinds of holiday.</i>
epithelial	Relating to or denoting the thin tissue forming the outer layer of a body's surface and lining the alimentary canal and other hollow structures. <i>Ovarian epithelial tumours.</i>
<u>evident</u>	Clearly seen or understood; obvious. <i>She ate the biscuits with evident enjoyment.</i>
expressly	Explicitly; clearly. <i>She was expressly forbidden to use the stove.</i>
identifiable	Able to be recognized; distinguishable. <i>There are no easily identifiable features on the shoreline.</i>

marked	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>A scar marked face.</i>
<u>noticeable</u>	Undesirably noticeable. <i>Noticeable shadows under her eyes.</i>
noticeably	In a way that is easily seen or noticed; clearly. <i>After surgery she deteriorated noticeably.</i>
obvious	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>It was obvious a storm was coming in.</i>
obviously	Unmistakably (‘plain’ is often used informally for ‘plainly’). <i>Obviously everyone has to do what they think is right.</i>
pronounced	Very noticeable or marked; conspicuous. <i>He had a pronounced squint.</i>
<u>recognizable</u>	Easily perceived; easy to become aware of. <i>His car was instantly recognizable.</i>
<u>seemingly</u>	From appearances alone-Thomas. <i>A seemingly competent and well organized person.</i>
<u>specialized</u>	Requiring or involving detailed and specific knowledge or training. <i>Specialized software.</i>
<u>specifically</u>	In distinction from others. <i>Some collectors maintain spaces specifically to house their larger works of art.</i>
<u>unambiguous</u>	Having or exhibiting a single clearly defined meaning. <i>Instructions should be unambiguous.</i>
<u>unlike</u>	Marked by dissimilarity. <i>They seemed utterly unlike despite being twins.</i>
visibly	In a visible manner. <i>She stretched out a visibly shaking hand.</i>
