| <b>differentiated</b>     | Exhibiting biological specialization; adapted during development to a specific function or environment.   |
| <b><u>discrete</u></b>    | Individually separate and distinct.<br><i>Speech sounds are produced as a continuous sound signal rather than <b>discrete</b> units.</i>  |
| <b>distinct</b>           | Recognizably different in nature from something else of a similar type.<br><i>A <b>distinct</b> flavor.</i>   |
| <b>distinctly</b>         | Clear to the mind; with distinct mental discernment.<br><i>He looked <b>distinctly</b> uncomfortable.</i>   |
| <b><u>distinguish</u></b> | Identify as in botany or biology, for example.<br><i>We must <b>distinguish</b> between two kinds of holiday.</i>   |
| <b>epithelial</b>         | Relating to or denoting the thin tissue forming the outer layer of a body's surface and lining the alimentary canal and other hollow structures.<br><i>Ovarian <b>epithelial</b> tumours.</i> |
| <b><u>evident</u></b>     | Clearly seen or understood; obvious.<br><i>She ate the biscuits with <b>evident</b> enjoyment.</i>  |
| <b>expressly</b>          | Explicitly; clearly.<br><i>She was <b>expressly</b> forbidden to use the stove.</i>   |
| <b>identifiable</b>       | Able to be recognized; distinguishable.<br><i>There are no easily <b>identifiable</b> features on the shoreline.</i>  |

| <b>marked</b>              | Strongly marked easily noticeable.<br><i>A scar <b>marked</b> face.</i>  |

| <b>noticeably</b>          | In a way that is easily seen or noticed; clearly.<br><i>After surgery she deteriorated <b>noticeably</b>.</i>                          |

| <b><u>recognizable</u></b> | Easily perceived; easy to become aware of.<br><i>His car was instantly <b>recognizable</b>.</i>  |
| <b><u>seemingly</u></b>    | From appearances alone-Thomas.<br><i>A <b>seemingly</b> competent and well organized person.</i>                                       |
| <b><u>specialized</u></b>  | Requiring or involving detailed and specific knowledge or training.<br><i><b>Specialized</b> software.</i>                             |
| <b><u>specifically</u></b> | In distinction from others.<br><i>Some collectors maintain spaces <b>specifically</b> to house their larger works of art.</i>          |
| <b><u>unambiguous</u></b>  | Having or exhibiting a single clearly defined meaning.<br><i>Instructions should be <b>unambiguous</b>.</i>                            |
| <b><u>unlike</u></b>       | Marked by dissimilarity.<br><i>They seemed utterly <b>unlike</b> despite being twins.</i>  |
