<b><u>addendum</u></b>	The radial distance from the pitch circle of a cogwheel or wormwheel to the crests of the teeth or ridges.

<b>adverb</b>	A word or phrase that modifies or qualifies an adjective verb or other adverb or a word group expressing a relation of place time circumstance manner cause degree etc e g gently quite then there.
<b><u>affix</u></b>	A linguistic element added to a word to produce an inflected or derived form. <i><b>Affix</b> the seal here.</i>
<b>attach</b>	Cause to be attached. <i>The Earl Marshal <b>attached</b> Gloucester for high treason.</i>
<b><u>capitalize</u></b>	Convert (a company's reserve funds) into capital. <i>The letter M either <b>capitalized</b> or in lower case is the abbreviation for mili.</i>
<b>codicil</b>	A supplement to a will; a testamentary instrument intended to alter an already executed will. <i>Francis has remembered him in a <b>codicil</b> to this will.</i>
<b><u>conjunction</u></b>	The grammatical relation between linguistic units words or phrases or clauses that are connected by a conjunction. <i>The planet reached <b>conjunction</b> with the sun.</i>
<b>connect</b>	Connect fasten or put together two or more pieces. <i>The blow <b>connected</b> and he felt a burst of pain.</i>
<b><u>derivative</u></b>	An expression representing the rate of change of a function with respect to an independent variable. <i>An artist who is not in the slightest bit <b>derivative</b>.</i>
<b>determiner</b>	A modifying word that determines the kind of reference a noun or noun group has, for example a, the, every.
<b><u>document</u></b>	Support or accompany with documentation. <i>The parents <b>documented</b> every step of their child s development.</i>

<b>however</b>	To whatever extent. <i>Although I m a little afraid <b>however</b> I d like to try it.</i>
<b><u>indicative</u></b>	The indicative mood. <b>Indicative</b> mood.
<b>infinitive</b>	Having or involving the basic form of a verb. <b>Infinitive</b> clauses.
<b>inflect</b>	Of a word or language undergo inflection. <i>All of these words <b>inflect</b> irregularly.</i>
<b>join</b>	Cause to become joined or linked. <b>Join</b> up the points in a different colour.
<b>noun</b>	A word other than a pronoun used to identify any of a class of people places or things common noun or to name a particular one of these proper noun.
<b>participle</b>	A word formed from a verb e g going gone being been and used as an adjective e g working woman burnt toast or a noun e g good breeding In English participles are also used to make compound verb forms e g is going has been.
<b>phrase</b>	Divide combine or mark into phrases. <i>To improve standards is the key <b>phrase</b> here.</i>
<b>postscript</b>	Textual matter that is added onto a publication; usually at the end. <i>He added a <b>postscript</b> Leaving tomorrow.</i>
<b><u>predicate</u></b>	What is predicated of the subject of a proposition the second term in a proposition is predicated of the first term by means of the copula. <i>Solving the problem is <b>predicated</b> on understanding it well.</i>
<b>prefix</b>	Add a prefix or introduction to something. <i>The Institute was granted the <b>prefix</b> Royal in 1961.</i>
<b>pronoun</b>	A word that can function as a noun phrase used by itself and that refers either to the participants in the discourse (e.g. I, you) or to someone or something mentioned elsewhere in the discourse (e.g. she, it, this).
<b>prospectus</b>	A formal written offer to sell securities (filed with the SEC) that sets forth a plan for a (proposed) business enterprise. <i>A <b>prospectus</b> should contain the facts that an investor needs to make an informed decision.</i>
<b>suffix</b>	Append something especially as a suffix. <b>Suffix</b> words.
<b><u>suggestive</u></b>	Tending to suggest something improper or indecent. <i>There were various <b>suggestive</b> pieces of evidence.</i>
<b>supplement</b>	A supplementary component that improves capability. <i>I looked for a part time job to <b>supplement</b> my income.</i>
