<u>addendum</u>	The radial distance from the pitch circle of a cogwheel or wormwheel to the crests of the teeth or ridges.
adjective	Of or relating to or functioning as an adjective. <i>Adjective law.</i>
adverb	A word or phrase that modifies or qualifies an adjective verb or other adverb or a word group expressing a relation of place time circumstance manner cause degree etc e g gently quite then there.
<u>affix</u>	A linguistic element added to a word to produce an inflected or derived form. <i>Affix the seal here.</i>
attach	Cause to be attached. <i>The Earl Marshal attached Gloucester for high treason.</i>
<u>capitalize</u>	Convert (a company's reserve funds) into capital. <i>The letter M either capitalized or in lower case is the abbreviation for mili.</i>
codicil	A supplement to a will; a testamentary instrument intended to alter an already executed will. <i>Francis has remembered him in a codicil to this will.</i>
<u>conjunction</u>	The grammatical relation between linguistic units words or phrases or clauses that are connected by a conjunction. <i>The planet reached conjunction with the sun.</i>
connect	Connect fasten or put together two or more pieces. <i>The blow connected and he felt a burst of pain.</i>
<u>derivative</u>	An expression representing the rate of change of a function with respect to an independent variable. <i>An artist who is not in the slightest bit derivative.</i>
determiner	A modifying word that determines the kind of reference a noun or noun group has, for example a, the, every.
<u>document</u>	Support or accompany with documentation. <i>The parents documented every step of their child s development.</i>

however	To whatever extent. <i>Although I m a little afraid however I d like to try it.</i>
<u>indicative</u>	The indicative mood. Indicative mood.
infinitive	Having or involving the basic form of a verb. Infinitive clauses.
inflect	Of a word or language undergo inflection. <i>All of these words inflect irregularly.</i>
join	Cause to become joined or linked. Join up the points in a different colour.
noun	A word other than a pronoun used to identify any of a class of people places or things common noun or to name a particular one of these proper noun.
participle	A word formed from a verb e g going gone being been and used as an adjective e g working woman burnt toast or a noun e g good breeding In English participles are also used to make compound verb forms e g is going has been.
phrase	Divide combine or mark into phrases. <i>To improve standards is the key phrase here.</i>
postscript	Textual matter that is added onto a publication; usually at the end. <i>He added a postscript Leaving tomorrow.</i>
<u>predicate</u>	What is predicated of the subject of a proposition the second term in a proposition is predicated of the first term by means of the copula. <i>Solving the problem is predicated on understanding it well.</i>
prefix	Add a prefix or introduction to something. <i>The Institute was granted the prefix Royal in 1961.</i>
pronoun	A word that can function as a noun phrase used by itself and that refers either to the participants in the discourse (e.g. I, you) or to someone or something mentioned elsewhere in the discourse (e.g. she, it, this).
prospectus	A formal written offer to sell securities (filed with the SEC) that sets forth a plan for a (proposed) business enterprise. <i>A prospectus should contain the facts that an investor needs to make an informed decision.</i>
suffix	Append something especially as a suffix. Suffix words.
<u>suggestive</u>	Tending to suggest something improper or indecent. <i>There were various suggestive pieces of evidence.</i>
supplement	A supplementary component that improves capability. <i>I looked for a part time job to supplement my income.</i>

Use a word that is not conventionally used as a verb typically a noun as a verb.
