Apposite as an Adjective

Definitions of "Apposite" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “apposite” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Apt in the circumstances or in relation to something.*
- *Being of striking appropriateness and pertinence.*

Synonyms of "Apposite" as an adjective (6 Words)

appropriate	Suitable for a particular person or place or condition etc. <i>A measure appropriate to a wartime economy.</i>
<u>apt</u>	Appropriate or suitable in the circumstances. <i>He is apt to ignore matters he considers unimportant.</i>
befitting	Appropriate to the occasion. <i>Behavior befitting a father.</i>
fitting	Being precisely fitting and right. <i>Loose fitting trousers.</i>
pertinent	Having precise or logical relevance to the matter at hand. <i>A list of articles pertinent to the discussion.</i>

suitable

Meant or adapted for an occasion or use.

*The parents found the girl **suitable** for their son.*

Usage Examples of "Apposite" as an adjective

- *An apposite quotation.*
- *The observations are apposite to the discussion.*
- *The successful copywriter is a master of apposite and evocative verbal images.*

Associations of "Apposite" (30 Words)

acknowledgement

A statement printed at the beginning of a book expressing the author's or publisher's gratitude to others.

*The reproduction on page 50 wasn't mentioned in the **acknowledgements**.*

affordable

That you have the financial means for.

***Affordable** homes.*

applicable

Relevant or appropriate.

*The same considerations are equally **applicable** to accident claims.*

appropriate

Devote (money or assets) to a special purpose.

*This isn't the **appropriate** time or place.*

appropriateness

The quality of being specially suitable.

*Activities are selected for their **appropriateness** to the day's weather.*

apropos

Introducing a different topic.

*The song feels **apropos** to a midnight jaunt.*

apt

Having a tendency to do something.

*She proved an **apt** pupil.*

befitting

Appropriate to.

*A country which can run the prestigious tournament in a **befitting** manner.*

blandness

The trait of exhibiting no personal embarrassment or concern.

*The overall **blandness** of his performance.*

congruous

Suitable or appropriate together.

*This explanation is **congruous** with earlier observations.*

correct

Socially right or correct.

*The government was **correct** to follow a course of defeating inflation.*

corrective

Designed to correct or counteract something harmful or undesirable.

***Corrective** lenses.*

felicitous	Well chosen or suited to the circumstances. <i>The view was the room's only felicitous feature.</i>
fitting	The action of fitting something. <i>It was fitting that his last innings for Middlesex should bring him his highest first class score.</i>
germane	Relevant and appropriate. <i>That is not germane to our theme.</i>
just	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>A just and democratic society.</i>
licit	Authorized, sanctioned by, or in accordance with law. <i>Usage patterns differ between licit and illicit drugs.</i>
opportune	Suitable or at a time that is suitable or advantageous especially for a particular purpose. <i>An opportune time to receive guests.</i>
pertinence	Relevance by virtue of being applicable to the matter at hand.
pertinent	Being of striking appropriateness and pertinence. <i>A list of articles pertinent to the discussion.</i>
proper	Denoting a subset or subgroup that does not constitute the entire set or group, especially one that has more than one element. <i>He finally has a proper job.</i>
properly	In the strict sense; exactly. <i>Algebra is properly speaking the analysis of equations.</i>
punctual	Happening or doing something at the agreed or proper time. <i>Punctual payment.</i>
relevance	The relation of something to the matter at hand. <i>The Web does allow us to produce more articles of relevance to our readers.</i>
relevant	Having a bearing on or connection with the subject at issue. <i>What small companies need is relevant advice.</i>
right	On or to the right side. <i>He guessed right.</i>
rightness	The quality or state of being morally good, justified, or acceptable. <i>The rightness of that move for me.</i>
seemly	Conforming to accepted notions of propriety or good taste; decorous. <i>Seemly behavior.</i>

suit

Slang a businessman dressed in a business suit.

*He could not compete with John in Marian's eyes and his **suit** came to nothing.*

timely

At an opportune time.

A **timely** warning.
