## Apposite as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Apposite" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “apposite” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Apt in the circumstances or in relation to something.*
- *Being of striking appropriateness and pertinence.*

### Synonyms of "Apposite" as an adjective (6 Words)

<b>appropriate</b>	Suitable for a particular person or place or condition etc. <i>A measure <b>appropriate</b> to a wartime economy.</i>
<b>apt</b>	Appropriate or suitable in the circumstances. <i>He is <b>apt</b> to ignore matters he considers unimportant.</i>
<b>befitting</b>	Appropriate to the occasion. <i>Behavior <b>befitting</b> a father.</i>
<b>fitting</b>	Being precisely fitting and right. <i>Loose <b>fitting</b> trousers.</i>
<b>pertinent</b>	Having precise or logical relevance to the matter at hand. <i>A list of articles <b>pertinent</b> to the discussion.</i>

**suitable** Meant or adapted for an occasion or use.  
*The parents found the girl **suitable** for their son.*

## Usage Examples of "Apposite" as an adjective

- *An apposite quotation.*
- *The observations are apposite to the discussion.*
- *The successful copywriter is a master of apposite and evocative verbal images.*

## Associations of "Apposite" (30 Words)

<b>acknowledgement</b>	A statement printed at the beginning of a book expressing the author's or publisher's gratitude to others. <i>The reproduction on page 50 wasn't mentioned in the <b>acknowledgements</b>.</i>
<b>affordable</b>	That you have the financial means for. <i><b>Affordable</b> homes.</i>
<b>applicable</b>	Relevant or appropriate. <i>The same considerations are equally <b>applicable</b> to accident claims.</i>
<b>appropriate</b>	Devote (money or assets) to a special purpose. <i>This isn't the <b>appropriate</b> time or place.</i>
<b>appropriateness</b>	The quality of being specially suitable. <i>Activities are selected for their <b>appropriateness</b> to the day's weather.</i>
<b>apropos</b>	Introducing a different topic. <i>The song feels <b>apropos</b> to a midnight jaunt.</i>
<b>apt</b>	Having a tendency to do something. <i>She proved an <b>apt</b> pupil.</i>
<b>befitting</b>	Appropriate to. <i>A country which can run the prestigious tournament in a <b>befitting</b> manner.</i>
<b>blandness</b>	The trait of exhibiting no personal embarrassment or concern. <i>The overall <b>blandness</b> of his performance.</i>
<b>congruous</b>	Suitable or appropriate together. <i>This explanation is <b>congruous</b> with earlier observations.</i>
<b>correct</b>	Socially right or correct. <i>The government was <b>correct</b> to follow a course of defeating inflation.</i>
<b>corrective</b>	Designed to correct or counteract something harmful or undesirable. <i><b>Corrective</b> lenses.</i>

<b>felicitous</b>	Well chosen or suited to the circumstances. <i>The view was the room's only <b>felicitous</b> feature.</i>
<b>fitting</b>	The action of fitting something. <i>It was <b>fitting</b> that his last innings for Middlesex should bring him his highest first class score.</i>
<b>germane</b>	Relevant and appropriate. <i>That is not <b>germane</b> to our theme.</i>
<b>just</b>	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>A <b>just</b> and democratic society.</i>
<b>licit</b>	Authorized, sanctioned by, or in accordance with law. <i>Usage patterns differ between <b>licit</b> and <b>illicit</b> drugs.</i>
<b>opportune</b>	Suitable or at a time that is suitable or advantageous especially for a particular purpose. <i>An <b>opportune</b> time to receive guests.</i>
<b>pertinence</b>	Relevance by virtue of being applicable to the matter at hand.
<b>pertinent</b>	Being of striking appropriateness and pertinence. <i>A list of articles <b>pertinent</b> to the discussion.</i>
<b>proper</b>	Denoting a subset or subgroup that does not constitute the entire set or group, especially one that has more than one element. <i>He finally has a <b>proper</b> job.</i>
<b>properly</b>	In the strict sense; exactly. <i>Algebra is <b>properly</b> speaking the analysis of equations.</i>
<b>punctual</b>	Happening or doing something at the agreed or proper time. <i><b>Punctual</b> payment.</i>
<b>relevance</b>	The relation of something to the matter at hand. <i>The Web does allow us to produce more articles of <b>relevance</b> to our readers.</i>
<b>relevant</b>	Having a bearing on or connection with the subject at issue. <i>What small companies need is <b>relevant</b> advice.</i>
<b>right</b>	On or to the right side. <i>He guessed <b>right</b>.</i>
<b>rightness</b>	The quality or state of being morally good, justified, or acceptable. <i>The <b>rightness</b> of that move for me.</i>
<b>seemly</b>	Conforming to accepted notions of propriety or good taste; decorous. <i><b>Seemly</b> behavior.</i>

Slang a businessman dressed in a business suit.

*He could not compete with John in Marian's eyes and his **suit** came to nothing.*

**timely**

At an opportune time.

*A **timely** warning.*
