
### **Apprehensive as an Adjective**

- Relating to perception or understanding.






## Synonyms of "Apprehensive" as an adjective (21 Words)

<u>afraid</u>	Filled with fear or apprehension. <i>Afraid</i> to show emotion.
agitated	Physically disturbed or set in motion. <i>Agitated</i> parents.
<u>alarmed</u>	Experiencing a sudden sense of danger.
anxious	Eagerly desirous. My parents were <b>anxious</b> that I get an education.
concerned	Culpably involved. Was <b>concerned</b> about the future.
discerning	Able to make or detect effects of great subtlety; sensitive. A <b>discerning</b> eye for color.
<u>edgy</u>	At the forefront of a trend; experimental or avant-garde. Their songs combine good music and smart <b>edgy</b> ideas.
fearful	Causing or likely to cause people to be afraid; horrifying. <i>He s <b>fearful</b> that his career is over.</i>
fidgety	Nervous and unable to relax. I get nervous and <b>fidgety</b> at the dentist.



frightened	Made afraid. The <b>frightened</b> child cowered in the corner.
<u>nervous</u>	Of or relating to the nervous system. A <b>nervous</b> addict.
<u>neurotic</u>	Having, caused by, or relating to neurosis. He seemed a <b>neurotic</b> self obsessed character.
panicky	Feeling or characterized by uncontrollable fear or anxiety. Became <b>panicky</b> as the snow deepened.
<u>restless</u>	Lacking or not affording physical or mental rest. The <b>restless</b> sea.
scared	Fearful; frightened. Too shocked and <b>scared</b> to move.
<u>strained</u>	Of a mainly liquid substance having been strained to separate out any solid matter. She gave a <b>strained</b> laugh.
stressed	Strengthened by the application of stress during manufacture prestressed. <i>Stressed concrete walls.</i>
<u>tense</u>	Pronounced with relatively tense tongue muscles e g the vowel sound in beat. <i>Relations between the two neighbouring states were tense</i> .
<u>terrified</u>	Thrown into a state of intense fear or desperation. The <b>terrified</b> horse bolted.
<u>uneasy</u>	Relating to bodily unease that causes discomfort. She lived in a state of <b>uneasy</b> truce with her strict father.
worried	Mentally upset over possible misfortune or danger etc. <i>He is <b>worried</b> that we are not sustaining high employment.</i>

<u>afraid</u>	Filled with regret or concern; used often to soften an unpleasant statement. She was <b>afraid</b> that he would be angry.
<u>alarmed</u>	Experiencing a sudden sense of danger.
anguished	Experiencing intense pain especially mental pain. <i>He gave an <b>anguished</b> cry.</i>
annoyed	Troubled persistently especially with petty annoyances. <i>He was <b>annoyed</b> at being woken up so early.</i>



anxious	Very eager or concerned to do something or for something to happen. My parents were <b>anxious</b> that I get an education.
concerned	Worried, troubled, or anxious. The villagers are <b>concerned</b> about burglaries.
<u>cowardice</u>	The trait of lacking courage. My <b>cowardice</b> got the better of me and I crept out of the room.
distressed	(of furniture or clothing) having simulated marks of age and wear. <b>Distressed</b> companies need loans and technical advice.
disturbed	Having the place or position changed. The <b>disturbed</b> books and papers on her desk.
embarrassed	Made to feel uncomfortable because of shame or wounded pride. <i>He had to sort out the <b>embarrassed</b> financial affairs of his brother.</i>
fearful	Causing or likely to cause people to be afraid; horrifying. Cast <b>fearful</b> glances at the large dog.
fraught	Filled with or attended with. Marketing any new product is <b>fraught</b> with danger.
harried	Feeling strained as a result of having demands persistently made on one; harassed. <i>Harried</i> detectives answer ringing phones.
inconvenient	Causing trouble, difficulties, or discomfort. The back hall is an <b>inconvenient</b> place for the telephone.
<u>insecurity</u>	The anxiety you experience when you feel vulnerable and insecure. Growing job <b>insecurity</b> .
irritated	Showing or feeling slight anger; annoyed. Made an <b>irritated</b> gesture.
<u>nervous</u>	Of or relating to the nervous system. A <b>nervous</b> thoroughbred.
neurotically	In a neurotic manner.
<u>precarious</u>	Not securely held or in position; dangerously likely to fall or collapse. <i>He made a <b>precarious</b> living as a painter.</i>
preoccupied	Deeply absorbed in thought. A <b>preoccupied</b> frown.
solicitous	Showing hovering attentiveness. <i>Solicitous</i> about the future.
solicitude	Care or concern for someone or something. I was touched by his <b>solicitude</b> .



stressed	Strengthened by the application of stress during manufacture prestressed. <i>He dropped out of the race clearly distressed and having difficulty breathing.</i>
<u>tense</u>	Become stretched or tense or taut. She tried to relax her <b>tense</b> muscles.
troubled	Characterized by unrest or disorder or insubordination. A <b>troubled</b> expression.
<u>uncomfortable</u>	Causing or feeling unease or awkwardness. An <b>uncomfortable</b> day in the hot sun.
<u>uneasy</u>	(of a situation or relationship) not settled; liable to change. An <b>uneasy</b> silence fell on the group.
upset	The act of upsetting something. With everything so <b>upset</b> .
worried	Mentally upset over possible misfortune or danger etc. One last <b>worried</b> check of the sleeping children.
<u>worry</u>	Lacerate by biting. I <b>worry</b> about the second Germanic consonant shift.
