### Definitions of "Apprentice" as a noun

- *A person who is learning a trade from a skilled employer, having agreed to work for a fixed period at low wages.*
- *Works for an expert to learn a trade.*
- *A beginner.*



## Synonyms of "Apprentice" as a noun (11 Words)

<b>fledgling</b>	A young bird that has just fledged. <i>The country's <b>fledgling</b> democracy.</i>
<b>learner</b>	Someone (especially a child) who learns (as from a teacher) or takes up knowledge or beliefs. <i>A fast <b>learner</b>.</i>
<b>mentee</b>	A person who is advised, trained, or counselled by a mentor.
<b>neophyte</b>	A new convert to a religion. <i>Four day cooking classes are offered to <b>neophytes</b> and experts.</i>
<b>novice</b>	An animal, especially a racehorse, that has not yet won a major prize or reached a sufficient level of performance to qualify for important events. <i>Last season as a <b>novice</b> he won three races.</i>
<b>novitiate</b>	Someone who has entered a religious order but has not taken final vows.
<b>prentice</b>	Works for an expert to learn a trade. <i>A tailor's <b>prentice</b>.</i>

<b>probationer</b>	A person who is serving a probationary or trial period in a job or position to which they are newly appointed.
<b>raw recruit</b>	Informal terms for nakedness.
<b><u>trainee</u></b>	Someone who is being trained. <b><i>Trainee</i></b> solicitors.
<b>tyro</b>	Someone new to a field or activity.

- architect** Design and configure (a program or system).  
*Few software packages were **architected** with Ethernet access in mind.*
- beginner** A person just starting to learn a skill or take part in an activity.  
*A **beginner** s guide.*
- blacksmith** A farrier.
- bricklayer** A craftsman skilled in building with bricks.
- builder** Someone who contracts for and supervises construction (as of a building).  
*Empire **builder**.*
- carpenter** Work as a carpenter.  
*She **carpenters** and goes on archaeological digs.*

<b>education</b>	The United States federal department that administers all federal programs dealing with education including federal aid to educational institutions and students created 1979. <i>His <b>education</b> is encyclopedic and eclectic.</i>
<b>electrician</b>	A person who installs or repairs electrical or telephone lines.
<b>fledgling</b>	(of a young bird) having acquired its flight feathers. <i>A <b>fledgling</b> enterprise.</i>
<b>freshman</b>	A first-year student at university. <i>A <b>freshman</b> senator.</i>
<b>glazier</b>	A person whose trade is fitting glass into windows and doors.
<b>grader</b>	A judge who assigns grades to something. <i>A first <b>grader</b>.</i>
<b>graduate</b>	A graduated cup tube flask or measuring glass used especially by chemists and pharmacists. <i>He <b>graduated</b> Harvard in 1965.</i>
<b>instructor</b>	A university teacher ranking below assistant professor. <i>A driving <b>instructor</b>.</i>
<b>learner</b>	A person who is learning to drive a motor vehicle and has not yet passed a driving test. <i>A fast <b>learner</b>.</i>
<b>neophyte</b>	A novice in a religious order, or a newly ordained priest. <i>A cast of <b>neophyte</b> actors.</i>
<b>newbie</b>	An inexperienced newcomer to a particular activity.
<b>newcomer</b>	A person who has recently arrived in a place. <i>She s a <b>newcomer</b> to the area.</i>
<b>novice</b>	Someone new to a field or activity. <i>Last season as a <b>novice</b> he won three races.</i>
<b>prentice</b>	Works for an expert to learn a trade. <i>My brother was <b>prenticed</b> to a wheelwright.</i>
<b>smith</b>	Rhodesian statesman who declared independence of Zimbabwe from Great Britain (born in 1919). <i>Tin bronze was cast into ingots before being <b>smithed</b> into bracelets.</i>
<b>sophomore</b>	Used of the second year in United States high school or college. <i>The duo s <b>sophomore</b> album.</i>
<b>starter</b>	A mixture of fermenting dough reserved from an earlier batch of baking, used to initiate fermentation in fresh dough. <i>I m just a slow <b>starter</b>.</i>

<b>student</b>	A learner who is enrolled in an educational institution. <i>A group of <b>student</b> nurses.</i>
<b>tanner</b>	A small coin of the United Kingdom worth six pennies; not minted since 1970. <i>Skincare companies are coming to the rescue of consumers with sunless <b>tanners</b>.</i>
<b>teaching</b>	The activities of educating or instructing; activities that impart knowledge or skill. <i>He prepared for <b>teaching</b> while still in college.</i>
<a href="#"><u>trainee</u></a>	A person undergoing training for a particular job or profession. <i><b>Trainee</b> solicitors.</i>
<b>training</b>	The action of teaching a person or animal a particular skill or type of behaviour. <i>In service <b>training</b> for staff.</i>
<b>tutorial</b>	A period of tuition given by a university or college tutor to an individual or very small group. <i>A <b>tutorial</b> on English poetry.</i>
<b>wright</b>	United States writer of detective novels (1888-1939).
