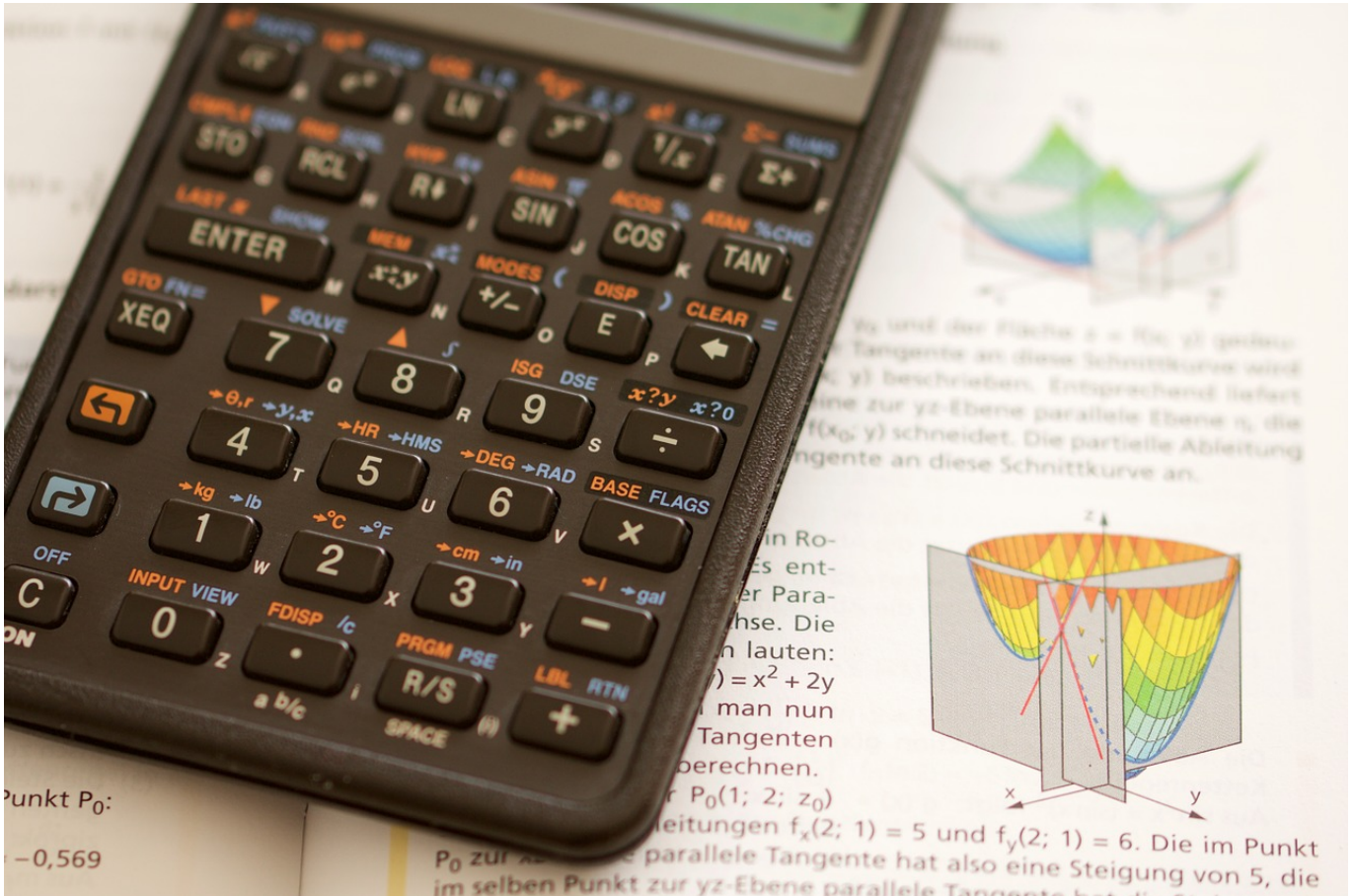
The synonyms of “Apprenticeship” are: traineeship, training period, studentship, novitiate

Definitions of "Apprenticeship" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “apprenticeship” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The position of apprentice.*
- *Works for an expert to learn a trade.*
- *The position of an apprentice.*



Synonyms of "Apprenticeship" as a noun (4 Words)

- novitiate** Someone who has entered a religious order but has not taken final vows.
A grant or payment made to support a student's education, awarded on the basis of academic or other achievement.
- studentship** Fully funded PhD **studentships** are restricted to students with a good degree in the physical sciences.
- traineeship** Financial aid that enables you to get trained for a specified job.
The bill provided **traineeships** in vocational rehabilitation.
- training period** Activity leading to skilled behavior.



Usage Examples of "Apprenticeship" as a noun

- *Six young chefs have completed their apprenticeships.*
- *The company once offered apprenticeships.*
- *He served his apprenticeship as a fitter.*
- *He's in the second year of his apprenticeship.*

Associations of "Apprenticeship" (30 Words)

architect

A person who is qualified to design buildings and to plan and supervise their construction.

*The great Norman **architect** of Durham Cathedral.*

beginner

A person who founds or establishes some institution.

*Language courses for **beginners**.*

blacksmith

A farrier.

bricklayer

A person whose job is to build walls, houses, and other structures with bricks.

builder	A person who constructs something by putting parts or material together. <i>Breaking the record was a real confidence builder.</i>
carpenter	Work as a carpenter. <i>The rails were carpentered very skilfully.</i>
education	The United States federal department that administers all federal programs dealing with education including federal aid to educational institutions and students created 1979. <i>Colleges of education.</i>
electrician	A person who installs or repairs electrical or telephone lines.
fledgling	Young and inexperienced. <i>A fledgling robin.</i>
freshman	Used of a person in the first year of an experience (especially in United States high school or college). <i>A freshman senator.</i>
glazier	A person whose trade is fitting glass into windows and doors.
grader	A wheeled machine for levelling the ground, especially in making roads. <i>A first grader.</i>
graduate	A person who has successfully completed a course of study or training especially a person who has been awarded an undergraduate or first academic degree. <i>He graduated in the summer with a 2 2 degree.</i>
instructor	A university teacher ranking below assistant professor. <i>A driving instructor.</i>
learner	Someone (especially a child) who learns (as from a teacher) or takes up knowledge or beliefs. <i>A fast learner.</i>
neophyte	A plant that is found in an area where it had not been recorded previously. <i>Four day cooking classes are offered to neophytes and experts.</i>
newbie	An inexperienced newcomer to a particular activity.
newcomer	A novice in a particular activity or situation. <i>Hill one of England s relative newcomers gave them the lead.</i>
novice	Someone who has entered a religious order but has not taken final vows. <i>Last season as a novice he won three races.</i>
prentice	Works for an expert to learn a trade. <i>My brother was prenticed to a wheelwright.</i>
smith	United States singer noted for her rendition of patriotic songs (1909-1986). <i>The wheels then needed the smith s attention.</i>

sophomore	Used of the second year in United States high school or college. <i>The duo s sophomore album.</i>
<u>starter</u>	A person who gives the signal for the start of a race. <i>The trainer has confirmed Cool Ground as a definite starter.</i>
student	A learner who is enrolled in an educational institution. Student loans.
tanner	A person who is employed to tan animal hides. <i>Skincare companies are coming to the rescue of consumers with sunless tanners.</i>
teaching	The occupation, profession, or work of a teacher. <i>I went into teaching because I like working with children.</i>
<u>trainee</u>	A person undergoing training for a particular job or profession. Trainee solicitors.
training	The action of undertaking a course of exercise and diet in preparation for a sporting event. <i>You ll have to go into strict training.</i>
tutorial	Relating to a tutor or a tutor's tuition. <i>A tutorial on English poetry.</i>
wright	Influential United States architect (1869-1959).
