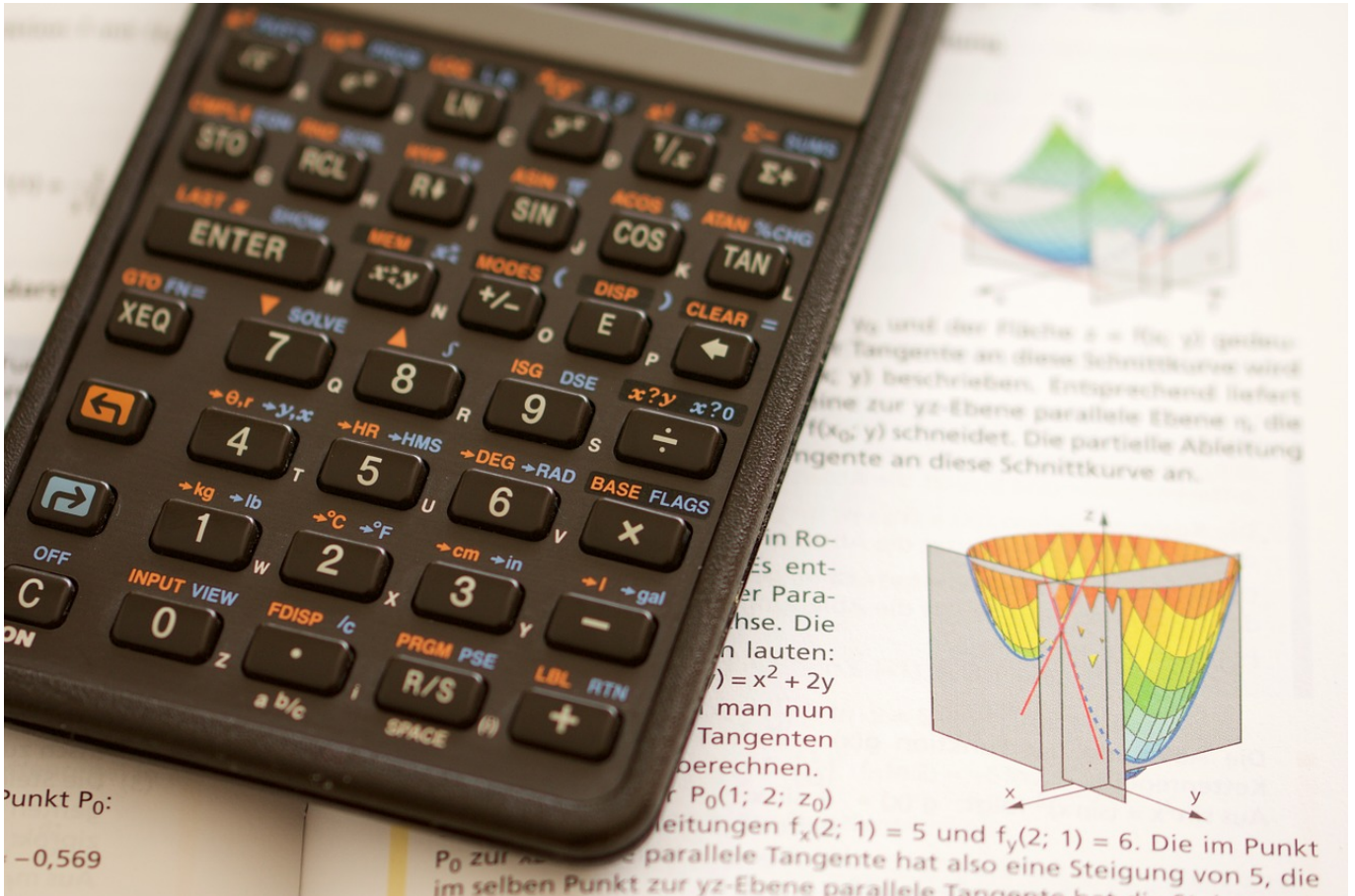

### **Definitions of "Apprenticeship" as a noun**

- *The position of apprentice.*
- *Works for an expert to learn a trade.*
- *The position of an apprentice.*



## Synonyms of "Apprenticeship" as a noun (4 Words)

- novitiate** Someone who has entered a religious order but has not taken final vows.  
A grant or payment made to support a student's education, awarded on the basis of academic or other achievement.
- studentship** Fully funded PhD **studentships** are restricted to students with a good degree in the physical sciences.
- traineeship** Financial aid that enables you to get trained for a specified job.  
The bill provided **traineeships** in vocational rehabilitation.
- training period** Activity leading to skilled behavior.



## Usage Examples of "Apprenticeship" as a noun

- *Six young chefs have completed their apprenticeships.*
- *The company once offered apprenticeships.*
- *He served his apprenticeship as a fitter.*
- *He's in the second year of his apprenticeship.*

## Associations of "Apprenticeship" (30 Words)

### [architect](#)

A person who is qualified to design buildings and to plan and supervise their construction.

*The great Norman **architect** of Durham Cathedral.*

### [beginner](#)

A person who founds or establishes some institution.

*Language courses for **beginners**.*

### [blacksmith](#)

A farrier.

### [bricklayer](#)

A person whose job is to build walls, houses, and other structures with bricks.

<b><u>builder</u></b>	A person who constructs something by putting parts or material together. <i>Breaking the record was a real confidence <b>builder</b>.</i>
<b><u>carpenter</u></b>	Work as a carpenter. <i>The rails were <b>carpentered</b> very skilfully.</i>
<b>education</b>	The United States federal department that administers all federal programs dealing with education including federal aid to educational institutions and students created 1979. <i>Colleges of <b>education</b>.</i>
<b>electrician</b>	A person who installs or repairs electrical or telephone lines.
<b><u>fledgling</u></b>	Young and inexperienced. <i>A <b>fledgling</b> robin.</i>
<b>freshman</b>	Used of a person in the first year of an experience (especially in United States high school or college). <i>A <b>freshman</b> senator.</i>
<b>glazier</b>	A person whose trade is fitting glass into windows and doors.
<b>grader</b>	A wheeled machine for levelling the ground, especially in making roads. <i>A first <b>grader</b>.</i>
<b><u>graduate</u></b>	A person who has successfully completed a course of study or training especially a person who has been awarded an undergraduate or first academic degree. <i>He <b>graduated</b> in the summer with a 2 2 degree.</i>
<b>instructor</b>	A university teacher ranking below assistant professor. <i>A driving <b>instructor</b>.</i>
<b><u>learner</u></b>	Someone (especially a child) who learns (as from a teacher) or takes up knowledge or beliefs. <i>A fast <b>learner</b>.</i>
<b><u>neophyte</u></b>	A plant that is found in an area where it had not been recorded previously. <i>Four day cooking classes are offered to <b>neophytes</b> and experts.</i>
<b>newbie</b>	An inexperienced newcomer to a particular activity.
<b><u>newcomer</u></b>	A novice in a particular activity or situation. <i>Hill one of England s relative <b>newcomers</b> gave them the lead.</i>
<b>novice</b>	Someone who has entered a religious order but has not taken final vows. <i>Last season as a <b>novice</b> he won three races.</i>
<b>prentice</b>	Works for an expert to learn a trade. <i>My brother was <b>prenticed</b> to a wheelwright.</i>
<b>smith</b>	United States singer noted for her rendition of patriotic songs (1909-1986). <i>The wheels then needed the <b>smith</b> s attention.</i>

<b>sophomore</b>	Used of the second year in United States high school or college. <i>The duo s <b>sophomore</b> album.</i>
<b><u>starter</u></b>	A person who gives the signal for the start of a race. <i>The trainer has confirmed Cool Ground as a definite <b>starter</b>.</i>
<b>student</b>	A learner who is enrolled in an educational institution. <b>Student</b> loans.
<b>tanner</b>	A person who is employed to tan animal hides. <i>Skincare companies are coming to the rescue of consumers with sunless <b>tanners</b>.</i>
<b>teaching</b>	The occupation, profession, or work of a teacher. <i>I went into <b>teaching</b> because I like working with children.</i>
<b><u>trainee</u></b>	A person undergoing training for a particular job or profession. <b>Trainee</b> solicitors.
<b>training</b>	The action of undertaking a course of exercise and diet in preparation for a sporting event. <i>You ll have to go into strict <b>training</b>.</i>
<b>tutorial</b>	Relating to a tutor or a tutor's tuition. <i>A <b>tutorial</b> on English poetry.</i>
<b>wright</b>	Influential United States architect (1869-1959).
