apposite	Being of striking appropriateness and pertinence. <i>The observations are apposite to the discussion.</i>
appropriate	Suitable for a particular person or place or condition etc. <i>A book not appropriate for children.</i>

apt	Having a tendency to do something. <i>The theme could not be more apt.</i>
becoming	Suitable or appropriate. <i>Her becoming modesty.</i>
befitting	Appropriate to. <i>A country which can run the prestigious tournament in a befitting manner.</i>
germane	Relevant to a subject under consideration. <i>He asks questions that are germane and central to the issue.</i>
material	Having material or physical form or substance Benjamin Jowett. <i>The material world.</i>
pertinent	Being of striking appropriateness and pertinence. <i>She asked me a lot of very pertinent questions.</i>
relevant	Appropriate to the current time, period, or circumstances; of contemporary interest. <i>The scientist corresponds with colleagues in order to learn about matters relevant to her own research.</i>
significant	Of considerable importance, size, or worth. <i>Statistically significant.</i>
suitable	Meant or adapted for an occasion or use. <i>These toys are not suitable for children under five.</i>

Usage Examples of "Apropos" as an adjective

- *The song feels apropos to a midnight jaunt.*

Synonyms of "Apropos" as an adverb (6 Words)

- by the bye** So as to pass a given point.
- by the way** In reserve; not for immediate use.
Used to add a further comment or a remark unconnected to the current subject; by the way.
- incidentally** *These magnificent achievements were only **incidentally** influenced by Oriental models.*
- seasonably** At an opportune time.
- timely** At an opportune time.
- well-timed** At an opportune time.

congruous	Suitable or appropriate together. <i>This explanation is congruous with earlier observations.</i>
<u>corrective</u>	A device for treating injury or disease. <i>Management were informed so that corrective action could be taken.</i>
felicitous	Pleasing and fortunate. <i>The view was the room s only felicitous feature.</i>
germane	Relevant and appropriate. <i>That is not germane to our theme.</i>
incidentally	Introducing a different topic. <i>These magnificent achievements were only incidentally influenced by Oriental models.</i>
<u>just</u>	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>A just cause.</i>
legitimate	Show or affirm to be just and legitimate. <i>The last legitimate Anglo Saxon king.</i>
licit	Sanctioned by custom or morality especially sexual morality. <i>Usage patterns differ between licit and illicit drugs.</i>
<u>opportune</u>	Done or occurring at a favourable time; well timed. <i>An opportune place to make camp.</i>
pertinence	Relevance by virtue of being applicable to the matter at hand.
pertinent	Being of striking appropriateness and pertinence. <i>A list of articles pertinent to the discussion.</i>
proper	Belonging or relating exclusively or distinctively to; particular to. <i>He finally has a proper job.</i>
<u>properly</u>	In the right manner. <i>I m trying to get my mother to behave properly.</i>
<u>punctual</u>	Denoting or relating to an action that takes place at a particular point in time. <i>Punctual payment.</i>
<u>relevance</u>	The relation of something to the matter at hand. <i>The quantity quality and relevance of links count towards your rating.</i>
<u>relevant</u>	Having a bearing on or connection with the subject at issue. <i>The candidate s experience is relevant to the job.</i>
right	Location near or direction toward the right side i e the side to the south when a person or object faces east. <i>We ll see you righted.</i>

rightness	The quality or state of being true or correct as a fact. <i>They argue for the moral rightness of overthrowing the leader by force.</i>
seasonable	Usual for or appropriate to a particular season of the year. <i>The seasonable temperatures.</i>
seemly	According with custom or propriety. <i>Seemly behavior.</i>
<u>timely</u>	At an opportune time. <i>A timely warning.</i>
