<b>relevant</b>	Appropriate to the current time, period, or circumstances; of contemporary interest. <i>The scientist corresponds with colleagues in order to learn about matters <b>relevant</b> to her own research.</i>
<b>significant</b>	Of considerable importance, size, or worth. <i>Statistically <b>significant</b>.</i>
<b>suitable</b>	Meant or adapted for an occasion or use. <i>These toys are not <b>suitable</b> for children under five.</i>

<b>germane</b>	Relevant and appropriate. <i>That is not <b>germane</b> to our theme.</i>
