<b>capable</b>	Possibly accepting or permitting. <i>The aircraft is <b>capable</b> of flying 5 000 miles non stop.</i>
<b>clever</b>	Mentally quick and resourceful. <i>Joe had a feeling it wasn't too <b>clever</b> leaving Dolly alone.</i>
<b>congruous</b>	In agreement or harmony. <i>This explanation is <b>congruous</b> with earlier observations.</i>
<b>disposed</b>	Usually followed by to naturally disposed toward. <i>James didn't seem <b>disposed</b> to take the hint.</i>
<b>felicitous</b>	Pleasing and fortunate. <i>The view was the room's only <b>felicitous</b> feature.</i>
<b>fit</b>	Having the requisite qualities or skills to undertake something competently. <i>Keeps <b>fit</b> with diet and exercise.</i>
<b>fitting</b>	Being precisely fitting and right. <i>A <b>fitting</b> reward.</i>
<b>given</b>	Inclined or disposed to. <i>She was not often <b>given</b> to anger.</i>
<b>inclined</b>	At an angle to the horizontal or vertical position. <i>An <b>inclined</b> ramp.</i>
<b>intelligent</b>	(of a computer terminal) incorporating a microprocessor and having its own processing capability. <i>Anna is <b>intelligent</b> and hard working.</i>
<b>judicious</b>	Having, showing, or done with good judgement or sense. <i>The <b>judicious</b> use of public investment.</i>
<b>liable</b>	Subject to legal action. <i><b>Liable</b> to criminal charges.</i>
<b>likely</b>	Likely but not certain to be or become true or real. <i>She is <b>likely</b> to forget.</i>
<b>minded</b>	Naturally disposed toward. <i>I am not <b>minded</b> to answer any questions.</i>
<b>pertinent</b>	Relevant or applicable to a particular matter; apposite. <i>Practitioners must consider all factors <b>pertinent</b> to a situation.</i>

<b><u>predisposed</u></b>	Made susceptible. <i>Because of conditions in the mine miners are <b>predisposed</b> to lung disease.</i>
<b><u>prone</u></b>	With a downward slope or direction. <i>A child <b>prone</b> to mischief.</i>
<b>quick</b>	Moving quickly and lightly. <i>A <b>quick</b> temper.</i>
<b>quick to learn</b>	Performed with little or no delay.
<b>ready</b>	Completely prepared or in condition for immediate action or use or progress. <i>Could you have the list <b>ready</b> by this afternoon.</i>
<b><u>relevant</u></b>	Closely connected or appropriate to what is being done or considered. <i>Critics may find themselves unable to stay <b>relevant</b> in a changing world.</i>
<b><u>sharp</u></b>	Of a key having a sharp or sharps in the signature. <i><b>Sharp</b> criticism.</i>
<b>smart</b>	(of a place) fashionable and upmarket. <i>You look very <b>smart</b>.</i>
<b><u>subject</u></b>	Possibly accepting or permitting. <i><b>Subject</b> peoples.</i>
<b><u>suitable</u></b>	Right or appropriate for a particular person, purpose, or situation. <i>These toys are not <b>suitable</b> for children under five.</i>
<b>tending</b>	(usually followed by `to') naturally disposed toward.

<b>disposed</b>	Usually followed by to naturally disposed toward. <i>James didn't seem <b>disposed</b> to take the hint.</i>
<b>fain</b>	In a willing manner. <i>I would <b>fain</b> do it.</i>
<b>felicitous</b>	Well chosen or suited to the circumstances. <i>A <b>felicitous</b> phrase.</i>
<b>gladly</b>	With pleasure or gratitude; happily. <i>She offered me a lift and I <b>gladly</b> accepted.</i>
<b>inclined</b>	Having made preparations. <i>An <b>inclined</b> ramp.</i>
<b>licit</b>	Sanctioned by custom or morality especially sexual morality. <i>Usage patterns differ between <b>licit</b> and <b>illicit</b> drugs.</i>
<b>likely</b>	Likely but not certain to be or become true or real. <i>A <b>likely</b> result.</i>
<b>opportune</b>	(of a time) especially convenient or appropriate for a particular action or event. <i>He couldn't have arrived at a less <b>opportune</b> moment.</i>

<b>pertinence</b>	Relevance by virtue of being applicable to the matter at hand.
<b>pertinent</b>	Relevant or applicable to a particular matter; apposite. <i>A list of articles <b>pertinent</b> to the discussion.</i>
<b><u>prone</u></b>	Lying face downward. <i>He was written off by many as too injury <b>prone</b>.</i>
<b>proper</b>	Belonging to oneself or itself; own. <i><b>Proper</b> medical treatment.</i>
<b><u>properly</u></b>	Thoroughly; completely. <i>Please do your job <b>properly</b>.</i>
<b><u>punctual</u></b>	Acting or arriving or performed exactly at the time appointed. <i>She expected guests to be <b>punctual</b> at meals.</i>
<b>ready</b>	Make ready or suitable or equip in advance for a particular purpose or for some use event etc. <i>A <b>ready</b> source of cash.</i>
<b><u>relevance</u></b>	The quality or state of being closely connected or appropriate. <i>This film has contemporary <b>relevance</b>.</i>
<b><u>relevant</u></b>	Having a bearing on or connection with the subject at issue. <i>Her films are <b>relevant</b> for feminists today.</i>
<b>rightness</b>	The quality or state of being true or correct as a fact. <i>They are convinced of the <b>rightness</b> of their theories.</i>
<b>seemly</b>	According with custom or propriety. <i>I felt it was not <b>seemly</b> to observe too closely.</i>
<b><u>timely</u></b>	Before a time limit expires. <i>With <b>timely</b> treatment the patient has a good chance of recovery.</i>
