
# Arbiter as a Noun

An independent person or body officially appointed to settle a dispute. arbitrator The facts of the case are put to an independent **arbitrator**. (usually plural) persons who exercise (administrative) control over others. authority She spoke with **authority**. A mechanism that controls the operation of a machine. controller A temperature **controller**. A person who expresses an unfavourable opinion of something. critic A theatre **critic**. **determiner** A person or thing that determines or decides something. Member of a board of directors. director The sales **director**. A person who is very knowledgeable about or skilful in a particular area. expert A financial **expert**. The head of a public institution. governor The **governor** of the Bank of England. A person who decides the results of a competition. judge She was a good **judge** of character. Someone who holds a master s degree from academic institution. master One of the old **master**s. Someone who has been admitted to membership in a scholarly field. pundit Political **pundit**s were tipping him for promotion. An official at a baseball game. umpire An **umpire** was appointed to settle the tax case.

adjudicate	Make a formal judgement on a disputed matter. The father <b>adjudicate</b> d when the sons were quarreling over their inheritance.
arbitrate	(of an independent person or body) reach an authoritative judgement or settlement. <i>The board has the power to arbitrate in disputes.</i>
<u>arbitration</u>	The use of an arbitrator to settle a dispute. <i>Tayside Regional Council called for <b>arbitration</b> to settle the dispute.</i>
assessor	A person who is knowledgeable in a particular field and is called upon for advice, typically by a judge or committee of inquiry. The <b>assessor</b> interviews the candidates and observes them actually using the language.
call	A direction in a square dance given by the caller. A <b>call</b> to all sides to remain calm and refrain from violence.
choose	Pick out select or choose from a number of alternatives. I always <b>choose</b> the fish over the meat courses in this restaurant.
commandment	A divine rule, especially one of the Ten Commandments. She had followed her mother s <b>commandment</b> s for long enough.
<u>conclude</u>	Decide by reasoning; draw or come to a conclusion. The committee <b>conclude</b> d the meeting.
conclusion	The last section of a communication. In <b>conclusion</b> I want to say.
decide	Cause to decide. The judge <b>decide</b> d the case in favor of the plaintiff.
decision	The ability or tendency to make decisions quickly decisiveness. A <b>decision</b> unfavorable to the opposition.
definitive	A definitive postage stamp. A <b>definitive</b> verdict.
<u>determination</u>	A position or opinion or judgment reached after consideration. <i>His <b>determination</b> showed in his every movement.</i>
determine	Find out learn or determine with certainty usually by making an inquiry or other effort. He <b>determine</b> d on a withdrawal of his forces.
deterministic	An inevitable consequence of antecedent sufficient causes. A <b>deterministic</b> theory.
irrevocable	Incapable of being retracted or revoked- Shakespeare. An <b>irrevocable</b> step.



<u>judge</u>	Judge tentatively or form an estimate of quantities or time. It is hard to <b>judge</b> whether such opposition is justified.
judgement	(law) the determination by a court of competent jurisdiction on matters submitted to it. <i>County court <b>judgement</b>s against individuals in debt.</i>
legislate	Provide or prepare for (an occurrence. We cannot <b>legislate</b> how people spend their free time.
linesman	A person who installs or repairs electrical or telephone lines.
persuasiveness	The power to induce the taking of a course of action or the embracing of a point of view by means of argument or entreaty.
referee	Be a referee or umpire in a sports competition. He <b>referee</b> d two of the first round group matches.
resolve	Cause (a symptom or condition) to heal or subside. <i>He <b>resolve</b>d never to drink again.</i>
resolved	Determined. Constance was <b>resolved</b> not to cry.
ruling	Currently exercising authority or influence. <i>The <b>ruling</b> coalition.</i>
select	Pick out select or choose from a number of alternatives. <i>He joined his <b>select</b> team of young Intelligence operatives.</i>
supervisor	A person who directs and oversees the work of a postgraduate research student.
tribunal	An assembly (including one or more judges) to conduct judicial business. <i>An international war crimes <b>tribunal</b></i> .
umpire	Be a referee or umpire in a sports competition. <i>He</i> <b>umpire</b> d the World Cup final.
