According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "arbitrary" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Based on random choice or personal whim, rather than any reason or system.
- (of power or a ruling body) unrestrained and autocratic in the use of authority.
- Based on or subject to individual discretion or preference or sometimes impulse or caprice.
- (of a constant or other quantity) of unspecified value.

A most haphazard system of record keeping.

inconsistent Displaying a lack of consistency.

He had done nothing **inconsistent** with his morality.

Not allowing contradiction or refusal.

Spoke in **peremptory** tones.

Unfamiliar or unspecified.

randomThe class was hard but he was so **random** that it was always fun.

summary Not including needless details or formalities; brief.

Summary arrest.

tyrannical Characteristic of tyranny; oppressive and controlling.

A **tyrannical** parent.

tyrannous Marked by unjust severity or arbitrary behavior.

A **tyrannous** disregard for the welfare of the workers.

unpredictable Unknown in advance.

An **unpredictable** or indeterminable future.

Determined by chance or impulse or whim rather than by necessity or

whimsical reason.

The victim of **whimsical** persecutions.

wild Produced from wild animals or plants without cultivation.

Wild tribes.

indiscriminate Done at random or without careful judgement.

The **indiscriminate** use of antibiotics can cause problems.

perfunctorily In a set manner without serious attention. He kissed her cheek **perfunctorily**.

randomize Arrange in random order.

You can **randomize** the ingredients with the tap of a button.

randomly In a random manner.

Done or completed too hurriedly; hasty.

slapdash Hurriedly and carelessly.

Slapdash work.

slipshod Marked by great carelessness.

Slipshod spelling.

spasmodic Occurring or done in brief, irregular bursts.

Spasmodic fighting continued.

A swift flying insectivorous bird with long slender wings and a

superficial resemblance to a swallow spending most of its life on the

wing.

The water was very **swift**.

unjustified Not shown to be right or reasonable.

Unjustified price increases.

unpredictable Not capable of being foretold.

The **unpredictable** weather of the Scottish islands.
