Definitions of "Arcade" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “arcade” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A covered passage with arches along one or both sides.*
- *A covered walk with shops along one or both sides.*
- *A series of arches supporting a wall, or set along it.*
- *A structure composed of a series of arches supported by columns.*
- *A covered passageway with shops and stalls on either side.*



Synonyms of "Arcade" as a noun (11 Words)

cloister	A courtyard with covered walks (as in religious institutions). <i>The shadowed cloisters of the convent.</i>
colonnade	A row of trees or other tall objects.
forum	A website or web page where users can post comments about a particular issue or topic and reply to other users' postings. <i>We hope these pages act as a forum for debate.</i>
<u>gallery</u>	A covered corridor (especially one extending along the wall of a building and supported with arches or columns). <i>In the minstrels gallery a string orchestra plays themes from film soundtracks.</i>
loggia	A gallery or room with one or more open sides, especially one that forms part of a house and has one side open to the garden.
peristyle	A space such as a court or porch that is surrounded or edged by a peristyle.

portico

A structure consisting of a roof supported by columns at regular intervals, typically attached as a porch to a building.

shopping centre

Searching for or buying goods or services.

shopping complex

shopping precinct

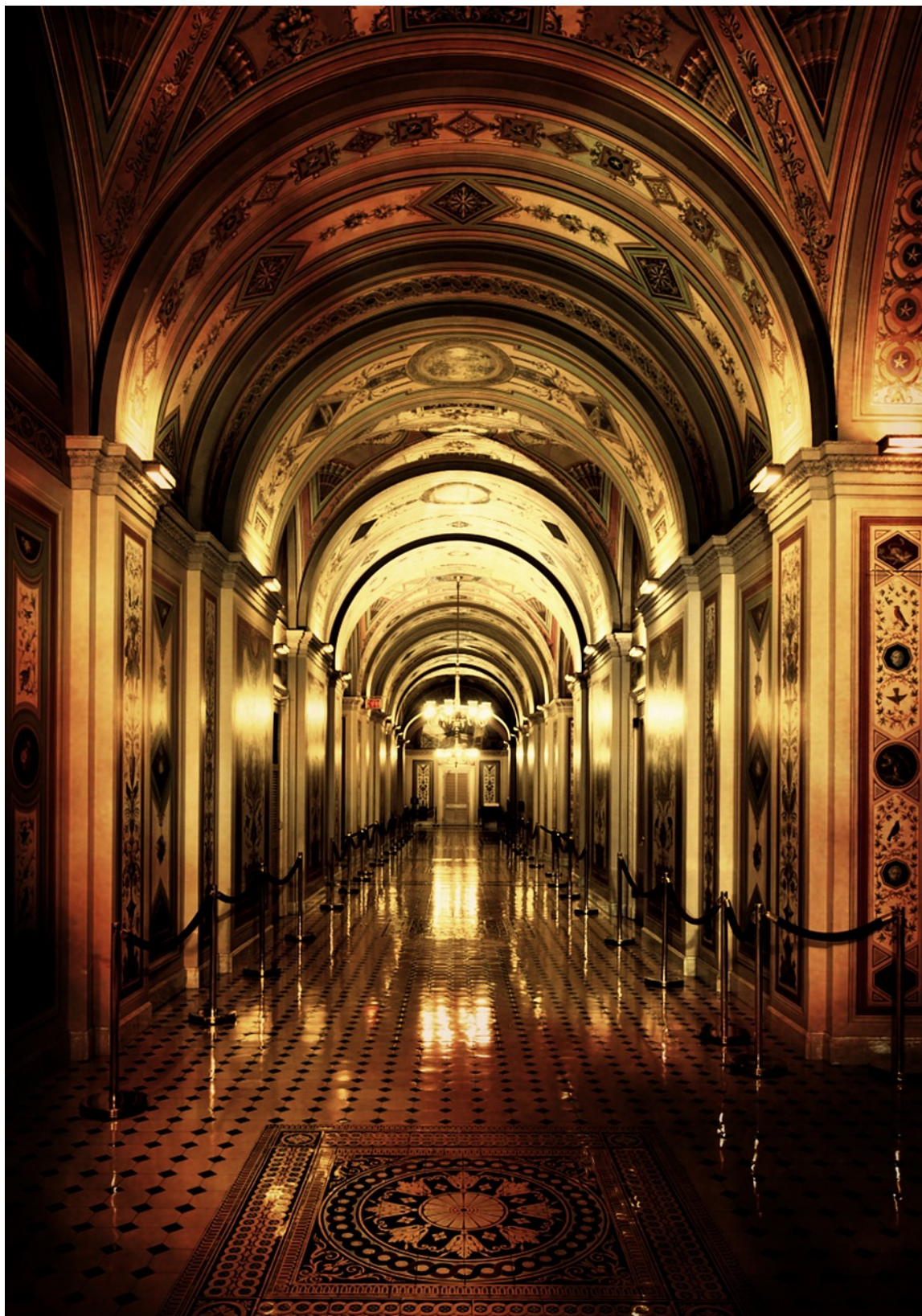
stoa

Associations of "Arcade" (30 Words)

aisle	Part of a church divided laterally from the nave proper by rows of pillars or columns. <i>The tiled roof over the south aisle.</i>
amenities	Things that make you comfortable and at ease.
bingo	A game in which players mark off numbers on cards as the numbers are drawn randomly by a caller, the winner being the first person to mark off all their numbers. <i>A bingo hall.</i>
classic	An artist who has created classic works. <i>A classical ballet.</i>
colonnade	A row of evenly spaced columns supporting a roof, an entablature, or arches.
convivial	(of an atmosphere or event) friendly, lively, and enjoyable. <i>A convivial atmosphere at the reunion.</i>
dancer	A performer who dances professionally. <i>She thought he would become a ballet dancer.</i>
entertainment	The action of providing or being provided with amusement or enjoyment. <i>A theatrical entertainment.</i>
exhibition	A display or demonstration of a skill. <i>He never lent his treasures out for exhibition.</i>
expo	A large international exhibition.
foyer	An entrance hall in a house or flat. <i>The foyer of the concert hall.</i>
gallery	The highest balcony in a theatre, containing the cheapest seats. <i>In the minstrels gallery a string orchestra plays themes from film soundtracks.</i>
game	A score of 100 points for tricks bid and made the best of three games constituting a rubber. <i>Rooks attempted to raise his game to another level.</i>
gangway	A passage between rows of seats, especially in a theatre or aircraft.
hall	A university building containing rooms for students to live in. <i>Halls of learning.</i>
hobby	An auxiliary activity. <i>Her hobbies are reading and gardening.</i>
infotainment	A film or TV program presenting the facts about a person or event.

<u>leisure</u>	Freedom to choose a pastime or enjoyable activity. <i>He lacked the leisure for golf.</i>
monumental	Of outstanding significance. <i>Additional details are found in monumental inscriptions.</i>
narrow	A narrow channel connecting two larger areas of water. <i>Won by a narrow margin.</i>
nave	The central part of a church building, intended to accommodate most of the congregation. In traditional Western churches it is rectangular, separated from the chancel by a step or rail, and from adjacent aisles by pillars.
<u>passage</u>	Subject a strain of microorganisms or cells to a passage. <i>The outward passage took 10 days.</i>
pastime	An activity that someone does regularly for enjoyment rather than work; a hobby. <i>His favourite pastimes were shooting and golf.</i>
purchase	Something acquired by purchase. <i>He could get no purchase on the situation.</i>
recreation	Activity that refreshes and recreates; activity that renews your health and spirits by enjoyment and relaxation. <i>Sport and recreation facilities.</i>
<u>roof</u>	Function as the roof of. <i>A thatched roof.</i>
shopping	The commodities purchased from storeswomen carrying home shopping didn't give me a second glance. <i>A bag of shopping.</i>
<u>sociable</u>	A tricycle with two seats side by side. <i>A sociable conversation.</i>
<u>theater</u>	The art of writing and producing plays. <i>He served in the Vietnam theater for three years.</i>
<u>walkway</u>	A path set aside for walking.
