Guy looked blankly **inscrutable**.

**mysterious** The new insurance policy is written without cryptic or **mysterious** 

terms

mystery Secrecy or obscurity.

How it got out is a **mystery**.

Relating to or characteristic of mysticism.

mystic Mystical intuition.

The supposed practice of communicating with the dead, especially in

**necromancy** order to predict the future.

Make obscure or unclear.
