- arrow** A mark or sign resembling an arrow used to show direction or position.  
*We followed a series of **arrows**.*

- badminton** A game with rackets in which a shuttlecock is hit back and forth across a net.
- bow** Play on a stringed instrument with a bow.  
*He pointed the **bow** of the boat toward the finish line.*
- bowed** Of a stringed instrument; sounded by stroking with a bow.
- bowstring** Strangle with a bowstring a former Turkish method of execution.
- brandish** Wave or flourish (something, especially a weapon) as a threat or in anger or excitement.  
***Brandish** a sword.*
- cudgel** Strike with a cudgel.  
*They would lie in wait and **cudgel** her to death.*
- equipment** The process of supplying someone or something with necessary equipment.  
*Suppliers of office **equipment**.*
- fencing** The action of conducting a discussion or argument in an evasive way.  
*Security **fencing**.*
- fighting** The act of fighting any contest or struggle.  
*There was **fighting** in the streets.*
- gun** A person who shoots a gun as regards their ability.  
*Two runners started before the **gun**.*
- indicator** A compound that changes colour at a specific pH value or in the presence of a particular substance, and can be used to monitor acidity, alkalinity, or the progress of a reaction.  
*The raccoon is a poor choice as an **indicator** of riparian habitat.*
- lancet** Shaped like a lancet arch.  
*A **lancet** clock.*
- projectile** Denoting or relating to a projectile.  
*A **projectile** force.*
- shield** A sporting trophy shaped like a shield consisting of an engraved metal plate mounted on a piece of wood.  
*Water is a relatively good **shield** against cosmic rays.*
- shoot** An area of land used for shooting game.  
***Shoot** a glance.*
- soccer** A football game in which two teams of 11 players try to kick or head a ball into the opponents' goal.
- soldier** Serve as a soldier.  
*I **soldiered** with your father on his last four campaigns.*
- sport** Someone who engages in sports.  
*I won the 200 metres in the school **sports**.*

- sword** One of the suits in a tarot pack.  
*Not many perished by the **sword**.*
- tackle** Try to take the ball from (an opponent) by intercepting them.  
*The right **tackle** is a straight A student.*
- trigger** Release or pull the trigger on.  
*Burglars fled empty handed after **triggering** the alarm.*
- volleyball** The inflated ball used in volleyball.
- weapon** Any instrument or instrumentality used in fighting or hunting.  
*Resignation threats had long been a **weapon** in his armoury.*
- whizz** An act of urinating.  
*Cobbled streets where people **whizzed** back and forth on bicycles.*
