- arch** An arch forming a monument or ornamental feature.  
*Her back **arches**.*
- archery** Shooting with a bow and arrows, especially at a target as a sport.
- armor** Equip with armor.
- arrow** A mark or sign resembling an arrow used to show direction or position.  
*We followed a series of **arrows**.*

<b>badminton</b>	A game with rackets in which a shuttlecock is hit back and forth across a net.
<b>bow</b>	Play on a stringed instrument with a bow. <i>He pointed the <b>bow</b> of the boat toward the finish line.</i>
<b>bowed</b>	Of a stringed instrument; sounded by stroking with a bow.
<b>bowstring</b>	Strangle with a bowstring a former Turkish method of execution.
<b>brandish</b>	Wave or flourish (something, especially a weapon) as a threat or in anger or excitement. <i><b>Brandish</b> a sword.</i>
<b>cudgel</b>	Strike with a cudgel. <i>They would lie in wait and <b>cudgel</b> her to death.</i>
<b>equipment</b>	The process of supplying someone or something with necessary equipment. <i>Suppliers of office <b>equipment</b>.</i>
<b>fencing</b>	The action of conducting a discussion or argument in an evasive way. <i>Security <b>fencing</b>.</i>
<b>fighting</b>	The act of fighting any contest or struggle. <i>There was <b>fighting</b> in the streets.</i>
<b>gun</b>	A person who shoots a gun as regards their ability. <i>Two runners started before the <b>gun</b>.</i>
<b>indicator</b>	A compound that changes colour at a specific pH value or in the presence of a particular substance, and can be used to monitor acidity, alkalinity, or the progress of a reaction. <i>The raccoon is a poor choice as an <b>indicator</b> of riparian habitat.</i>
<b>lancet</b>	Shaped like a lancet arch. <i>A <b>lancet</b> clock.</i>
<b>projectile</b>	Denoting or relating to a projectile. <i>A <b>projectile</b> force.</i>
<b>shield</b>	A sporting trophy shaped like a shield consisting of an engraved metal plate mounted on a piece of wood. <i>Water is a relatively good <b>shield</b> against cosmic rays.</i>
<b>shoot</b>	An area of land used for shooting game. <i><b>Shoot</b> a glance.</i>
<b>soccer</b>	A football game in which two teams of 11 players try to kick or head a ball into the opponents' goal.
<b>soldier</b>	Serve as a soldier. <i>I <b>soldiered</b> with your father on his last four campaigns.</i>
<b>sport</b>	Someone who engages in sports. <i>I won the 200 metres in the school <b>sports</b>.</i>



**sword**

One of the suits in a tarot pack.  
*Not many perished by the **sword**.*

**tackle**

Try to take the ball from (an opponent) by intercepting them.  
*The right **tackle** is a straight A student.*

**trigger**

Release or pull the trigger on.  
*Burglars fled empty handed after **triggering** the alarm.*

**volleyball**

The inflated ball used in volleyball.

**weapon**

Any instrument or instrumentality used in fighting or hunting.  
*Resignation threats had long been a **weapon** in his armoury.*

**whizz**

An act of urinating.  
*Cobbled streets where people **whizzed** back and forth on bicycles.*
