
### Archetype as a Noun

#### Definitions of "Archetype" as a noun

- (in Jungian theory) a primitive mental image inherited from the earliest human ancestors, and supposed to be present in the collective unconscious.
- A recurrent symbol or motif in literature, art, or mythology.
- Something that serves as a model or a basis for making copies.
- A very typical example of a certain person or thing.
- An original which has been imitated; a prototype.





## Synonyms of "Archetype" as a noun (11 Words)

embodiment	A new personification of a familiar idea. It was in Germany alone that his hope seemed capable of <b>embodiment</b>
incarnation	The form taken by a person or thing during an incarnation. In a previous journalistic <b>incarnation</b> I worked at Westminster.
<u>original</u>	An original creation i e an audio recording from which copies can be made. <i>This painting is a copy of the <b>original</b>.</i>
<u>paragon</u>	An ideal instance; a perfect embodiment of a concept. It would have taken a <b>paragon</b> of virtue not to feel viciously jealous.
personification	A figure intended to represent an abstract quality. <i>He was the very <b>personification</b> of British pluck and diplomacy.</i>
<u>pilot</u>	Something that serves as a model or a basis for making copies. A strike by local airline <b>pilot</b> s.



prototype	A standard or typical example. He is the <b>prototype</b> of good breeding.
representative	A person who represents others. The Cambodian <b>representative</b> to the UN.
stereotype	A conventional or formulaic conception or image. <i>Regional <b>stereotype</b>s have been part of America since its founding.</i>
type	Metal types used in letterpress printing. She s not really my <b>type</b> .
typification	A representational or typifying form or model.



### Usage Examples of "Archetype" as a noun

- Mythological archetypes of good and evil.
- An instrument which was the archetype of the early flute.
- *He was the archetype of the old-style football club chairman.*

archetypal	Representing or constituting an original type after which other similar things are patterned. <i>Archetypal myths.</i>
beginning	The background or origins of a person or organization. <i>He had risen from humble <b>beginning</b>s to great wealth.</i>
creative	A person whose job involves creative work. <i>Creative</i> work.
creatively	In a creative manner. This article inspires you to think <b>creatively</b> .
emboss	Carve, mould, or stamp a design on (a surface or object) so that it stands out in relief. <i>They used special tools to <b>emboss</b> the leather.</i>



<u>epitome</u>	A person or thing that is a perfect example of a particular quality or type. She looked the <b>epitome</b> of elegance and good taste.
example	A thing characteristic of its kind or illustrating a general rule. There is an <b>example</b> on page 10.
<u>exemplar</u>	A person or thing serving as a typical example or appropriate model. The place is an <b>exemplar</b> of multicultural Britain.
<u>groundbreaking</u>	The ceremonial breaking of the ground to formally begin a construction project. <i>Groundbreaking</i> research into fertility problems.
herbarium	A room or building housing a herbarium.
<u>imaginative</u>	(used of persons or artifacts) marked by independence and creativity in thought or action. Making <b>imaginative</b> use of computer software.
inaugural	An inaugural speech especially one made by an incoming US president. <i>His inaugural concert as Music Director.</i>
inception	The establishment or starting point of an institution or activity. She has been on the board since its <b>inception</b> two years ago.
<u>incipient</u>	Only partly in existence; imperfectly formed. An <b>incipient</b> black eye.
initial	Mark with one s initials. <i>Initial</i> consonants.
initially	At the beginning. <i>Initially</i> he thought the new concept was nonsense.
innovative	Being or producing something like nothing done or experienced or created before. Is British industry <b>innovative</b> enough.
<u>instance</u>	An example or single occurrence of something. A serious <b>instance</b> of corruption.
<u>inventive</u>	Marked by independence and creativity in thought or action- Lewis Mumford. <i>Inventive</i> ceramics.
manuscript	A book, document, or piece of music written by hand rather than typed or printed. Several <b>manuscript</b> s in his own hand.
model	Create a representation or model of. <i>Model</i> citizens.



mythological	Relating to, based on, or appearing in myths or mythology. The tree of life is one of the oldest of all <b>mythological</b> symbols.
<u>original</u>	An original creation i e an audio recording from which copies can be made. The <b>original</b> performance of the opera.
<u>paradigm</u>	The class of all items that can be substituted into the same position or slot in a grammatical sentence are in paradigmatic relation with one another. Society s <b>paradigm</b> of the ideal woman.
paradigmatic	Of or denoting the relationship between a set of linguistic items that form mutually exclusive choices in particular syntactic roles. <i>His biography is <b>paradigmatic</b> of the experiences of this generation.</i>
prototype	Make a prototype of a product. The construction of bandpass networks from low pass <b>prototype</b> s.
<u>quintessential</u>	Representing the most perfect or typical example of a quality or class. <i>He was the <b>quintessential</b> tough guy strong silent and self contained.</i>
<u>sample</u>	Take a sample of. They shared these characteristics with other women in the <b>sample</b> .
<u>specimen</u>	An individual animal, plant, piece of a mineral, etc. used as an example of its species or type for scientific study or display. A <b>specimen</b> paper of the new test.
unabridged	(used of texts) not shortened. An <b>unabridged</b> edition.
