## Synonyms of "Ardent" as an adjective (24 Words)

### ablaze

Filled with anger or another strong emotion.  
*Forests set **ablaze** or *afire* by lightning.*

### aflame

In flames; burning.  
*Pour brandy over the steaks and then set **aflame**.*

### avid

(often followed by `for') ardently or excessively desirous.  
*An **avid** reader of science fiction.*

### blazing

Without any attempt at concealment; completely obvious.  
*She had a **blazing** row with Eddie and stormed out.*

### burning

Of urgent interest and importance; exciting or calling for debate.  
*A **burning** building.*

<b>eager</b>	Strongly wanting to do or have something. <i>The man was <b>eager</b> to please.</i>
<b>emotional</b>	Of more than usual emotion. <i>Gaining <b>emotional</b> support from relatives.</i>
<b>fervent</b>	Hot, burning, or glowing. <i>A <b>fervent</b> desire to change society.</i>
<b>fervid</b>	Intensely enthusiastic or passionate, especially to an excessive degree. <i>His <b>fervid</b> protestations of love.</i>
<b>fierce</b>	Having or displaying an intense or ferocious aggressiveness. <i>The tiger is the largest member of the cat family and a <b>fierce</b> predator.</i>
<b>fiery</b>	Having a passionate and quick-tempered nature. <i><b>Fiery</b> oratory.</i>
<b>flaming</b>	Burning fiercely and emitting flames. <i>A <b>flaming</b> row.</i>
<b>hot-blooded</b>	Prone to emotion.
<b>impassioned</b>	Filled with or showing great emotion. <i>She made an <b>impassioned</b> plea for help.</i>
<b>intense</b>	Extremely sharp or intense. <i>The heat was <b>intense</b>.</i>
<b>passionate</b>	Arising from intense feelings of sexual love. <i><b>Passionate</b> pleas for help.</i>
<b>perfervid</b>	Characterized by intense emotion. <i><b>Perfervid</b> nationalism.</i>
<b>red-hot</b>	Newest or most recent.
<b>torrid</b>	Extremely hot and dry. <i>Hot trumpets and <b>torrid</b> rhythms.</i>
<b>vehement</b>	Characterized by great force or energy. <i>Her voice was low but <b>vehement</b>.</i>
<b>warm</b>	Inducing the impression of warmth used especially of reds and oranges and yellows. <i>I walked quickly to keep <b>warm</b>.</i>
<b>white-hot</b>	Intensely zealous or fervid.
<b>wholehearted</b>	With unconditional and enthusiastic devotion. <i><b>Wholehearted</b> commitment.</i>
<b>zealous</b>	Having or showing zeal. <i>The council was extremely <b>zealous</b> in the application of the regulations.</i>

## Associations of "Ardent" (30 Words)

<b>admirer</b>	A person who has a sexual or romantic interest in someone. <i>She had many <b>admirers</b>.</i>
<b>agog</b>	Very eager or curious to hear or see something. <i>Papa was <b>agog</b> with curiosity.</i>
<b>burning</b>	The act of burning something. <i>A <b>burning</b> building.</i>
<b>devote</b>	Invoke or pronounce a curse upon. <i>The hostile army was <b>devoted</b> with dire execrations to the gods of war.</i>
<b>devotee</b>	An ardent follower and admirer. <i>A <b>devotee</b> of Lewis Carroll.</i>
<b>eager</b>	A high wave (often dangerous) caused by tidal flow (as by colliding tidal currents or in a narrow estuary). <i>An <b>eager</b> look.</i>
<b>earnest</b>	Sincerely earnest. <i>Both sides were deeply in <b>earnest</b> even passionate.</i>
<b>enthusiasm</b>	Something that arouses enthusiasm. <i>The three <b>enthusiasms</b> of his life were politics religion and books.</i>
<b>enthusiast</b>	An ardent and enthusiastic supporter of some person or activity. <i>A sports car <b>enthusiast</b>.</i>
<b>enthusiastic</b>	Having or showing great excitement and interest. <i>An <b>enthusiastic</b> response.</i>
<b>enthusiastically</b>	With enthusiasm; in an enthusiastic manner. <i>The audience applauded <b>enthusiastically</b>.</i>
<b>fan</b>	A thing resembling an open fan. <i>There are great waste <b>fans</b> at the foot of the Andes in the desert.</i>

<b>fanatic</b>	A person with an obsessive interest in and enthusiasm for a particular activity. A <b>fanatic</b> is one who can't change his mind and won't change the subject.
<b>fervent</b>	Characterized by intense emotion. A <b>fervent</b> desire to change society.
<b>fervid</b>	Extremely hot- Nathaniel Hawthorne- Frances Trollope. His <b>fervid</b> protestations of love.
<b>fevor</b>	The state of being emotionally aroused and worked up.
<b>fever</b>	Bring about a high body temperature or a state of nervous excitement in. She had a slight <b>fever</b> .
<b>fiery</b>	Showing strong emotion, typically anger. <b>Fiery</b> oratory.
<b>heartily</b>	To a great degree; very (especially with reference to personal feelings). They dined <b>heartily</b> .
<b>impassioned</b>	Characterized by intense emotion. An <b>impassioned</b> appeal.
<b>overly</b>	To a degree exceeding normal or proper limits. She was a jealous and <b>overly</b> possessive woman.
<b>passion</b>	An account of the Passion from any of the Gospels. She nurses a <b>passion</b> for Thomas.
<b>passionate</b>	Having, showing, or caused by strong feelings or beliefs. A <b>passionate</b> kiss.
<b>passionately</b>	In a way that shows strong feelings or beliefs. Ruth was <b>passionately</b> interested in politics.
<b>strenuous</b>	Taxing to the utmost; testing powers of endurance. <b>Strenuous</b> exercise.
<b>torrid</b>	Full of difficulty. <b>Torrid</b> jazz bands.
<b>votary</b>	A devoted follower, adherent, or advocate of someone or something. A <b>votary</b> of Aphrodite.
<b>zealot</b>	A person who is fanatical and uncompromising in pursuit of their religious, political, or other ideals.
<b>zealotry</b>	Fanatical and uncompromising pursuit of religious, political, or other ideals; fanaticism. He expressed concern about religious <b>zealotry</b> playing an increasing role in politics.
