### Synonyms of "Ardent" as an adjective (24 Words)

<u>ablaze</u>	Filled with anger or another strong emotion. Forests set <b>ablaze</b> or afire by lightning.
aflame	In flames; burning. Pour brandy over the steaks and then set <b>aflame</b> .
<u>avid</u>	(often followed by `for') ardently or excessively desirous. An <b>avid</b> reader of science fiction.
<u>blazing</u>	Without any attempt at concealment; completely obvious. She had a <b>blazing</b> row with Eddie and stormed out.
burning	Of urgent interest and importance; exciting or calling for debate. A <b>burning</b> building.



eager	Strongly wanting to do or have something. The man was <b>eager</b> to please.
emotional	Of more than usual emotion. Gaining <b>emotional</b> support from relatives.
<u>fervent</u>	Hot, burning, or glowing. A <b>fervent</b> desire to change society.
fervid	Intensely enthusiastic or passionate, especially to an excessive degree. <i>His fervid protestations of love.</i>
<u>fierce</u>	Having or displaying an intense or ferocious aggressiveness. The tiger is the largest member of the cat family and a <b>fierce</b> predator.
fiery	Having a passionate and quick-tempered nature. <i>Fiery</i> oratory.
flaming	Burning fiercely and emitting flames. A <b>flaming</b> row.
hot-blooded	Prone to emotion.
<b>impassioned</b>	Filled with or showing great emotion. She made an <b>impassioned</b> plea for help.
intense	Extremely sharp or intense. The heat was <b>intense</b> .
passionate	Arising from intense feelings of sexual love. <i>Passionate</i> pleas for help.
perfervid	Characterized by intense emotion. <i>Perfervid</i> nationalism.
red-hot	Newest or most recent.
torrid	Extremely hot and dry. <i>Hot trumpets and <b>torrid</b> rhythms.</i>
<u>vehement</u>	Characterized by great force or energy. <i>Her voice was low but <b>vehement</b></i> .
warm	Inducing the impression of warmth used especially of reds and oranges and yellows. I walked quickly to keep <b>warm</b> .
white-hot	Intensely zealous or fervid.
wholehearted	With unconditional and enthusiastic devotion. Wholehearted commitment.
<u>zealous</u>	Having or showing zeal. The council was extremely <b>zealous</b> in the application of the regulations.

agog	Very eager or curious to hear or see something. Papa was <b>agog</b> with curiosity.
<u>burning</u>	The act of burning something. A <b>burning</b> building.
<u>devote</u>	Invoke or pronounce a curse upon. The hostile army was <b>devote</b> d with dire execrations to the gods of war.
devotee	An ardent follower and admirer. A <b>devotee</b> of Lewis Carroll.
eager	A high wave (often dangerous) caused by tidal flow (as by colliding tidal currents or in a narrow estuary. An <i>eager</i> look.
earnest	Sincerely earnest. Both sides were deeply in <b>earnest</b> even passionate.
enthusiasm	Something that arouses enthusiasm. The three <b>enthusiasm</b> s of his life were politics religion and books.
enthusiast	An ardent and enthusiastic supporter of some person or activity. A sports car <b>enthusiast</b> .
enthusiastic	Having or showing great excitement and interest. An <b>enthusiastic</b> response.
enthusiastically	With enthusiasm; in an enthusiastic manner. The audience applauded <b>enthusiastically</b> .
<u>fan</u>	A thing resembling an open fan. There are great waste <b>fan</b> s at the foot of the Andes in the desert.



fanatic	A person with an obsessive interest in and enthusiasm for a particular activity. A <b>fanatic</b> is one who can t change his mind and won t change the subject.
<u>fervent</u>	Characterized by intense emotion. A <b>fervent</b> desire to change society.
fervid	Extremely hot- Nathaniel Hawthorne- Frances Trollope. His <b>fervid</b> protestations of love.
<u>fervor</u>	The state of being emotionally aroused and worked up.
fever	Bring about a high body temperature or a state of nervous excitement in. <i>She had a slight fever.</i>
fiery	Showing strong emotion, typically anger. <i>Fiery</i> oratory.
heartily	To a great degree; very (especially with reference to personal feelings. <i>They dined heartily.</i>
impassioned	Characterized by intense emotion. An <b>impassioned</b> appeal.
<u>overly</u>	To a degree exceeding normal or proper limits. She was a jealous and <b>overly</b> possessive woman.
passion	An account of the Passion from any of the Gospels. She nurses a <b>passion</b> for Thomas.
passionate	Having, showing, or caused by strong feelings or beliefs. A <b>passionate</b> kiss.
passionately	In a way that shows strong feelings or beliefs. Ruth was <b>passionately</b> interested in politics.
strenuous	Taxing to the utmost; testing powers of endurance. <i>Strenuous</i> exercise.
torrid	Full of difficulty. <i>Torrid jazz bands.</i>
votary	A devoted follower, adherent, or advocate of someone or something. A <b>votary</b> of Aphrodite.
zealot	A person who is fanatical and uncompromising in pursuit of their religious, political, or other ideals.
zealotry	Fanatical and uncompromising pursuit of religious, political, or other ideals; fanaticism. He expressed concern about religious <b>zealotry</b> playing an increasing role in politics.
