<u>realm</u>	A primary biogeographical division of the earth's surface. <i>The defence of the realm.</i>
<u>scene</u>	The pieces of scenery used in a play or opera. <i>Scene changes.</i>
scene of action	A situation treated as an observable object.
<u>sector</u>	The minimum track length that can be assigned to store information unless otherwise specified a sector of data consists of 512 bytes. <i>Operations in the southern sector of the North Sea.</i>
sphere	The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>The markers on the route included two conspicuous black spheres.</i>
sports stadium	Someone who engages in sports.
stadium	An ancient Roman or Greek measure of length about 185 metres originally the length of a stadium.
<u>stage</u>	The theater as a profession usually the stage. <i>Then we embarked on the second stage of our Caribbean cruise.</i>
<u>territory</u>	(especially in the US, Canada, or Australia) an organized division of a country that is not yet admitted to the full rights of a state. <i>Sorties into enemy territory.</i>
theatre	An operating theatre. <i>This is intense moving and inspiring theatre.</i>
world	Human and social interaction. <i>The outdoor world.</i>

fishing	The occupation of catching fish for a living. <i>The area is renowned for its excellent deep sea fishing.</i>
game	Play video games. <i>They played word games.</i>
gladiator	A professional boxer.
golf	Play golf. <i>He was a fixture at the golf club in Rockport where he golfed until his early nineties.</i>
grandstand	Of a view seen from an advantageous position as if from a grandstand. <i>She never misses a chance to grandstand.</i>
gymnastics	Exercises developing or displaying physical agility and coordination The modern sport of gymnastics typically involves exercises on bars beam floor and vaulting horse. <i>These vocal gymnastics make the music unforgettable.</i>
kick	Kick a leg up. <i>The swimmer's kicking left a wake behind him.</i>
paddock	Keep a horse in a paddock. <i>I went across the course to see the horses in the paddock.</i>
path	A course of conduct. <i>The hurricane demolished houses in its path.</i>
playground	An outdoor area provided for children to play in, especially at a school or public park. <i>Playground games.</i>
racetrack	A track for motor racing.
recreational	Relating to or denoting drugs taken on an occasional basis for enjoyment. <i>Money to provide recreational facilities.</i>

running	Of advancing the ball by running. <i>The team's running plays worked better than its pass plays.</i>
sphere	The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>His social sphere is limited.</i>
sphericity	The roundness of a 3-dimensional object.
sport	Someone who engages in sports. <i>A good sport.</i>
sporting	Connected with or interested in sport. <i>Sporting gents and their ladies.</i>
stadium	An ancient Roman or Greek measure of length about 185 metres originally the length of a stadium.
volley	Make a volley. <i>Gun shots volleyed at the attackers.</i>
volleyball	An inflated ball used in playing volleyball.
