<u><b>province</b></u>	A principal administrative division of a country or empire. <i>I made my way home to the dreary <b>provinces</b> by train.</i>
<u><b>realm</b></u>	A primary biogeographical division of the earth's surface. <i>The defence of the <b>realm</b>.</i>
<u><b>scene</b></u>	The pieces of scenery used in a play or opera. <i><b>Scene</b> changes.</i>
<b>scene of action</b>	A situation treated as an observable object.
<u><b>sector</b></u>	The minimum track length that can be assigned to store information unless otherwise specified a sector of data consists of 512 bytes. <i>Operations in the southern <b>sector</b> of the North Sea.</i>
<b>sphere</b>	The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>The markers on the route included two conspicuous black <b>spheres</b>.</i>
<b>sports stadium</b>	Someone who engages in sports.
<b>stadium</b>	An ancient Roman or Greek measure of length about 185 metres originally the length of a stadium.
<u><b>stage</b></u>	The theater as a profession usually the stage. <i>Then we embarked on the second <b>stage</b> of our Caribbean cruise.</i>
<u><b>territory</b></u>	(especially in the US, Canada, or Australia) an organized division of a country that is not yet admitted to the full rights of a state. <i>Sorties into enemy <b>territory</b>.</i>
<b>theatre</b>	An operating theatre. <i>This is intense moving and inspiring <b>theatre</b>.</i>
<b>world</b>	Human and social interaction. <i>The outdoor <b>world</b>.</i>

<b>gladiator</b>	A professional boxer.
<b>golf</b>	Play golf. <i>He was a fixture at the <b>golf</b> club in Rockport where he <b>golfed</b> until his early nineties.</i>
<b>grandstand</b>	Of a view seen from an advantageous position as if from a grandstand. <i>She never misses a chance to <b>grandstand</b>.</i>
<b>gymnastics</b>	Exercises developing or displaying physical agility and coordination The modern sport of gymnastics typically involves exercises on bars beam floor and vaulting horse. <i>These vocal <b>gymnastics</b> make the music unforgettable.</i>
<a href="#"><u>kick</u></a>	Kick a leg up. <i>The swimmer's <b>kicking</b> left a wake behind him.</i>
<b>paddock</b>	Keep a horse in a paddock. <i>I went across the course to see the horses in the <b>paddock</b>.</i>

<b>sphere</b>	The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>His social <b>sphere</b> is limited.</i>
<b>sphericity</b>	The roundness of a 3-dimensional object.
<b>sport</b>	Someone who engages in sports. <i>A good <b>sport</b>.</i>
<b>sporting</b>	Connected with or interested in sport. <i><b>Sporting</b> gents and their ladies.</i>
<b>stadium</b>	An ancient Roman or Greek measure of length about 185 metres originally the length of a stadium.
