Meteorology of climates and their phenomena.
*The role of clouds is one of the big conundrums of **climatology**.*

dehydrate

Lose water or moisture.
*Carry **dehydrated** food on your camping trip.*

desert

Desert a cause a country or an army often in order to join the opposing cause country or army.
*If soldiers **deserted** Hitler s army they were shot.*

desertification	The gradual transformation of habitable land into desert; is usually caused by climate change or by destructive use of the land. <i>The dust storms in Korea are the result of rapid desertification in China.</i>
desiccate	Lose water or moisture. <i>A desiccate romance.</i>
desiccated	(of food) dried in order to preserve it. <i>Old boxes of desiccated Cuban cigars.</i>
drought	A prolonged shortage. <i>I asked for something to slake my drought.</i>
dry	The dry season. <i>Only dry bread and water.</i>
dryness	Lack of interest, excitement, or embellishment; dullness. <i>It does little to rescue the ordinary moment from dryness and tedium.</i>
evaporation	The process of something abstract ceasing to exist. <i>Snow cover prevents evaporation of water from the soil.</i>
famine	A shortage. <i>The cotton famine of the 1860s.</i>
forecast	A prediction about how something (as the weather) will develop. <i>Rain is forecast for Scotland.</i>
humid	Containing or characterized by a great deal of water vapor. <i>A hot and humid day.</i>
humidity	Wetness in the atmosphere. <i>The humidity should be supplied by regularly spraying the leaves.</i>
parch	Cause to wither or parch from exposure to heat. <i>The sun parched the earth.</i>
precipitation	The process of forming a chemical precipitate. <i>The storm brought several inches of precipitation.</i>
prolonged	Continuing for a long time or longer than usual; lengthy. <i>The region suffered a prolonged drought.</i>
seasonal	Occurring at or dependent on a particular season. <i>Seasonal rainfall.</i>
semiarid	Somewhat arid. <i>A semiarid region with little annual rainfall.</i>
shortage	The property of being an amount by which something is less than expected or required. <i>The problems of land shortage in the countryside.</i>

temperature	A body temperature above the normal. <i>I ll take her temperature.</i>
thirst	Have a craving, appetite, or great desire for. <i>An opponent thirsting for revenge.</i>
tropical	Very hot and humid. <i>A tropical rainforest.</i>
warmer	A device for warming something; a thing that warms. <i>Winter warmers like steamed syrup sponge.</i>
weather	Change under the action or influence of the weather. <i>A weathered old hut.</i>
weatherman	Predicts the weather.
withered	Lean and wrinkled by shrinkage as from age or illness-W.F.Starkie. <i>A girl with a withered arm.</i>
