- *A ship or boat.*
- *A low hut used to house livestock, often incorporating a covered run.*
- *(in the Bible) the ship built by Noah to save his family and two of every kind of animal from the Flood; Noah's ark.*
- *Sacred chest where the ancient Hebrews kept the two tablets containing the Ten Commandments.*
- *A boat built by Noah to save his family and animals from the flood.*
- *A chest or cupboard housing the Torah scrolls in a synagogue.*
- *(Judaism) sacred chest where the ancient Hebrews kept the two tablets containing the Ten Commandments.*
- *A small bivalve mollusc which attaches itself to rocks with byssus threads.*

| <b><u>sanctuary</u></b> | A holy place; a temple.<br><i>A donkey <b>sanctuary</b>.</i>  |
| <b>sanctum</b>          | A private place from which most people are excluded.<br><i>He withdrew to his <b>sanctum</b> sanctorum where the children could never go.</i> |
