arming	Any projection that is thought to resemble a human arm.
arms	The official symbols of a family, state, etc. <i>Arms and ammunition.</i>
artillery	A military detachment or branch of the armed forces that uses large-calibre guns. <i>Tanks and heavy artillery.</i>
cannon	A cylindrical piece of armor plate to protect the arm. <i>They would cross at the Town ford under cover of the defending cannon.</i>
equipping	The act of equipping with weapons in preparation for war.
firearms	A portable gun. <i>He wore his firearm in a shoulder holster.</i>
guns	A professional killer who uses a gun.

instruments of war	The semantic role of the entity (usually inanimate) that the agent uses to perform an action or start a process.
materiel	Information (data or ideas or observations) that can be used or reworked into a finished form. <i>The shipping of materiel south into the battle zone.</i>
military supplies	The military forces of a nation.
munitions	Defensive structure consisting of walls or mounds built around a stronghold to strengthen it.
ordnance	A branch of government service dealing especially with military stores and materials. <i>Unexploded ordnance.</i>
war machines	The waging of armed conflict against an enemy.
weaponry	Weapons regarded collectively. <i>America s weaponry.</i>
weapons	A means of persuading or arguing. <i>He used all his conversational weapons.</i>
weapons of war	A means of persuading or arguing.



Usage Examples of "Armament" as a noun

- *Armaments factories.*
- *They brought up more reinforcements and more armament.*
- *Instruments of disarmament rather than of armament.*
- *National armaments could be kept to a minimum.*



Associations of "Armament" (30 Words)

ammunition Any nuclear or chemical or biological material that can be used as a weapon of mass destruction.

*An **ammunition** dump.*

arm A thing comparable to an arm in form or function typically something that projects from a larger structure.

*The U S **armed** the freedom fighters in Afghanistan.*

armed Having arms or arms as specified; used especially in combination.
*Heavily **armed** troops.*

armored Protected by armor (used of persons or things military).

arms Weapons; armaments.

***Arms** exports.*

arsenal A collection of weapons and military equipment.

*We have an **arsenal** of computers at our disposal.*

artillery	A military detachment or branch of the armed forces that uses large-calibre guns. <i>Tanks and heavy artillery.</i>
bomber	A bomber jacket. <i>Manny hand rolled a couple of bombers.</i>
brigade	Form into a brigade. <i>A volunteer ambulance brigade.</i>
commander	A rank of naval officer above lieutenant commander and below captain. <i>The commander of a paratroop regiment.</i>
defensive	An attitude of defensiveness especially in the phrase on the defensive. <i>Defensive weapons.</i>
firearm	A rifle, pistol, or other portable gun. <i>Jones pleaded guilty to possessing a firearm with criminal intent.</i>
fortification	The art or science of strengthening defenses. <i>A medieval fortification.</i>
gun	Used as a nickname for a ship's gunnery officer. <i>A hired gun.</i>
legionary	A soldier who is a member of a legion (especially the French Foreign Legion). <i>The legionary fortress of Isca.</i>
military	The military forces of a nation. <i>As a young man he joined the military and pursued a career in the Army.</i>
militia	(in the US) all able-bodied civilians eligible by law for military service. <i>Creating a militia was no answer to the army's manpower problem.</i>
munition	Military weapons ammunition equipment and stores. <i>Munition factories.</i>
naval	Connected with or belonging to or used in a navy. <i>A naval base.</i>
ordnance	Large but transportable armament. <i>Unexploded ordnance.</i>
regiment	Assign to a regiment. <i>Regiment one's children.</i>
soldier	Serve as a soldier. <i>I soldiered with your father on his last four campaigns.</i>
submarine	Control a submarine. <i>The child was injured when he submarined under the safety belt of the car.</i>
tactic	An action or strategy carefully planned to achieve a specific end. <i>These are possible tax saving tactics to discuss with your accountant.</i>

- top** Reach or ascend the top of.
*The bus shelter at the **top** of the road.*
- turret** A rotating holder for tools, especially on a lathe.
*A castle with fairy tale **turrets**.*
- warfare** An active struggle between competing entities.
*Guerrilla **warfare**.*
- warship** A government ship that is available for waging war.
- weapon** A thing designed or used for inflicting bodily harm or physical damage.
*Nuclear **weapons**.*
- weaponry** Weapons regarded collectively.
*He is in charge of some of the most sophisticated **weaponry** ever designed.*
