- armed** Characterized by having or bearing arms.
*The many **armed** goddess Shiva.*
- army** The army of the United States of America the agency that organizes and trains soldiers for land warfare.
*An **army** of photographers.*
- artillery** A military detachment or branch of the armed forces that uses large-calibre guns.
*Tanks and heavy **artillery**.*

battalion	A large body of troops ready for battle, especially an infantry unit forming part of a brigade. <i>A battalion of ants.</i>
<u>brigade</u>	Form or unite into a brigade. <i>He commanded a brigade of 3 000 men.</i>
brigadier	A general officer ranking below a major general.
cantonment	A military garrison or camp.
centurion	The commander of a century in the ancient Roman army.
colonel	A rank of officer in the army and in the US air force above a lieutenant colonel and below a brigadier or brigadier general.
<u>commander</u>	A commissioned naval officer who ranks above a lieutenant commander and below a captain. <i>The commander of a paratroop regiment.</i>
commando	A unit of commandos. <i>A commando attack.</i>
deploy	Bring into effective action. <i>The air force began to deploy forward.</i>
<u>disarm</u>	Make less hostile; win over. <i>His tact and political skills will disarm critics.</i>
dragoon	A member of any of several cavalry regiments in the British army. <i>She had been dragooned into helping with the housework.</i>
<u>fortress</u>	A fortified defensive structure. <i>He had proved himself to be a fortress of moral rectitude.</i>
grenadier	A soldier armed with grenades.
<u>horde</u>	A large group of people. <i>A horde of beery rugby fans.</i>
<u>legion</u>	The Foreign Legion. <i>Her fans are legion.</i>
legionary	A soldier who is a member of a legion (especially the French Foreign Legion). <i>The legionary fortress of Isca.</i>
<u>military</u>	The military forces of a nation. <i>As a young man he joined the military and pursued a career in the Army.</i>
militia	(in the US) all able-bodied civilians eligible by law for military service. <i>Creating a militia was no answer to the army's manpower problem.</i>
naval	Relating to a navy or navies. <i>A naval officer.</i>

regiment	Form military personnel into a regiment. <i>Regiment one s children.</i>
regimental	Relating to a regiment. <i>Regimental traditions.</i>
<u>soldier</u>	Serve as a soldier. <i>I soldiered with your father on his last four campaigns.</i>
<u>squad</u>	A small squad of policemen trained to deal with a particular kind of crime. <i>The 39 year old actress and her squad snapped some pics together after the show.</i>
subaltern	An officer in the British army below the rank of captain, especially a second lieutenant. <i>The private tutor was a recognized subaltern part of the bourgeois family.</i>
<u>tank</u>	Fill the tank of a vehicle with fuel. <i>The powerful baseliner had tanked the match.</i>
<u>warrior</u>	Any of a number of standing poses in yoga in which the legs are held apart and the arms are stretched outwards. <i>The warrior heroes of ancient Greece.</i>
