- *Of or relating to or containing one or more benzene rings.*
- *Having a strong pleasant odor- Jean Stafford.*
- *Having a pleasant and distinctive smell.*
- *(chemistry) of or relating to or containing one or more benzene rings.*
- *Having a strong pleasant odor.*
- *Relating to or denoting organic compounds containing a planar unsaturated ring of atoms which is stabilized by an interaction of the bonds forming the ring, e.g. benzene and its derivatives.*

<b>fragrant</b>	Pleasant-smelling. <i>She gathered the <b>fragrant</b> blooms.</i>
<b>odoriferous</b>	Morally offensive. <i>An <b>odoriferous</b> pile of fish.</i>
<b>perfumed</b>	Impregnated or scented with a sweet-smelling substance. <i><b>Perfumed</b> soap.</i>
<b>redolent</b>	Noticeably odorous. <i>The pine woods were more <b>redolent</b>.</i>
<b>scented</b>	Having a pleasant scent. <i>A manure <b>scented</b> barnyard.</i>
<b>sweet-scented</b>	Having a natural fragrance.
<b>sweet-smelling</b>	Having a natural fragrance.

- ambrosial** Worthy of the gods.  
*Ambrosial* food.
- aroma** A subtle, pervasive quality or atmosphere.  
*The aroma* of officialdom.
- cloying** Excessively sweet, rich, or sentimental, especially to a disgusting or sickening degree.  
*A romantic rather cloying* story.
- confection** Make into a confection.  
*His elaborate pop confections.*
- delicious** Extremely pleasing to the sense of taste.  
*A delicious* joke.
- evocative** Bringing strong images, memories, or feelings to mind.  
*Powerfully evocative* lyrics.

<b>flavorful</b>	Full of flavor.
<b>fragrance</b>	A pleasant, sweet smell. <i>Our fine selection of classic <b>fragrances</b> for men and women.</i>
<b>fragrant</b>	Pleasant-smelling. <i>She gathered the <b>fragrant</b> blooms.</i>
<b>lovable</b>	Having characteristics that attract love or affection. <i>He has a <b>lovable</b> sweet personality.</i>
<b>mellifluous</b>	Pleasing to the ear. <i>Her low <b>mellifluous</b> voice.</i>
<b>musky</b>	Having a smell or taste like that of musk.
<b>nectary</b>	A gland (often a protuberance or depression) that secretes nectar.
<b>odoriferous</b>	Emitting an odor. <i><b>Odoriferous</b> spices.</i>
<b>odorous</b>	Emitting an odor. <i>The <b>odorous</b> air of the orchard.</i>
<b>perfume</b>	Impregnate with perfume or a sweet smelling substance. <i>Orange blossoms <b>perfumed</b> the air in the garden.</i>
<b>pudding</b>	The dessert course of a meal (‘pud’ is used informally). <i>What s for <b>pudding</b>.</i>
<b>redolent</b>	Noticeably odorous. <i>Air <b>redolent</b> with the fumes of beer and whiskey.</i>
<b>reminiscent</b>	Serving to bring to mind- Wilder Hobson. <i>Her robes were vaguely <b>reminiscent</b> of military dress.</i>
<b>saccharine</b>	Relating to or containing sugar; sugary. <i><b>Saccharine</b> music.</i>
<b>scent</b>	Sniff the air for a scent. <i>The <b>scent</b> of freshly cut hay.</i>
<b>seraphic</b>	Of or relating to an angel of the first order. <i>He imagined a <b>seraphic</b> presence in the room.</i>
<b>smell</b>	Smell bad. <i>Becoming deaf or blind or unable to <b>smell</b>.</i>
<b>suggestive</b>	(usually followed by ‘of’) pointing out or revealing clearly. <i>There were various <b>suggestive</b> pieces of evidence.</i>
<b>sweet</b>	A sweet dish forming a course of a meal a pudding or dessert. <i>Go to thy rest <b>sweet</b> sir.</i>

- tasty** Very attractive or appealing.  
*A **tasty** young lady.*
- treacle** Cloying sentimentality or flattery.  
*Enough of this **treacle** let s get back to business.*
- zesty** Marked by spirited enjoyment.
