Definitions of "Arrange" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “arrange” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Reach agreement about an action or event in advance.*
- *Organize or make plans for (a future event).*
- *Make arrangements for.*
- *Ensure that (something) is done or provided by organizing it in advance.*
- *Adapt for performance in a different way.*
- *Adapt (a musical composition) for performance with instruments or voices other than those originally specified.*
- *Arrange thoughts, ideas, temporal events.*
- *Arrange attractively.*
- *Put (things) in a neat, attractive, or required order.*
- *Set (printed matter) into a specific format.*

- *Settle (a dispute or claim).*
- *Put into a proper or systematic order.*
- *Plan, organize, and carry out (an event).*

Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions.
*The policies can be **adapted** to suit individual needs.*

adjust

Alter or regulate so as to achieve accuracy or conform to a standard.
*His eyes had **adjusted** to semi darkness.*

allow

Allow the other baseball team to score.
*This short story **allows** of several different interpretations.*

anticipate

Come or take place before (an event or process expected or scheduled for a later time).
*They failed to **anticipate** a full scale invasion.*

array	Lay out orderly or logically in a line or as if in a line. <i>The manifesto immediately divided the forces arrayed against him.</i>
be prepared	Have an existence, be extant.
cater	Supply food ready to eat; for parties and banquets. <i>My mother helped to cater for the party.</i>
clear up	Free (the throat) by making a rasping sound.
coif	Cover with a coif. <i>Gloria's hair was coiffed in its usual way.</i>
coiffe	Arrange attractively.
coiffure	Arrange attractively.
contrive	Put or send forth. <i>You contrived to be alone with me despite the supervision.</i>
devise	Come up with (an idea, plan, explanation, theory, or principle) after a mental effort. <i>Devise a plan to take over the director's office.</i>
display	Attract attention by displaying some body part or posing of animals. <i>National leaders will have to display the highest skills of statesmanship.</i>
dispose	Place or put in a particular order. <i>The Scottish champions were buoyant after they disposed of English champions Leeds.</i>
do	Get something done. <i>If a knife inserted into the centre comes out clean then your pie is done.</i>
dress	Add a dressing to a salad. <i>The field was dressed with unrotted farmyard manure.</i>
exhibit	Give an exhibition of to an interested audience. <i>No foreign painters were exhibited.</i>
fix	Make fixed stable or stationary. <i>Let's fix the date for the party.</i>
fix up	Make infertile.
format	Especially in computing arrange or put into a format. <i>Please format this disk before entering data.</i>
get ready	Cause to move; cause to be in a certain position or condition.
group	Form a group or group together. <i>Molluscs are grouped into seven different classes.</i>

harmonize	Sing or play in harmony. <i>The economic group founded to harmonize national development plans.</i>
<u>instrument</u>	Equip something with measuring instruments. <i>A DC 8 aircraft instrumented as a flying laboratory.</i>
lay out	Put in a horizontal position.
make arrangements	Assure the success of.
make plans	Put in order or neaten.
make preparations	Give rise to; cause to happen or occur, not always intentionally.
make provision	Appear to begin an activity.
<u>orchestrate</u>	Arrange or score (music) for orchestral performance. <i>The song cycle was stunningly arranged and orchestrated.</i>
order	Place in a certain order. <i>She ordered me to leave.</i>
<u>organize</u>	Cause to be structured or ordered or operating according to some principle or idea. <i>The soul doth organize the body.</i>
pencil in	Write, draw, or trace with a pencil.
plan	Design or make a plan of something to be made or built. <i>Plan an attack.</i>
position	Put into a certain place or abstract location. <i>I had positioned her as my antagonist.</i>
<u>prepare</u>	To prepare verbally either for written or spoken delivery. <i>The prince was prepared to become King one day.</i>
present	Bring forward and present to the mind. <i>We presented the arguments to him.</i>
put	Put into a certain place or abstract location. <i>We put the time of arrival at 8 P M.</i>
put in order	Cause (someone) to undergo something.
put out	Put into a certain place or abstract location.
regulate	Set (a clock or other apparatus) according to an external standard. <i>A hormone which regulates metabolism.</i>
<u>schedule</u>	Make a schedule plan the time and place for events. <i>The release of the single is scheduled for April.</i>
score	Write a musical score for. <i>The three judges each scored the bout 100 86 for the Panamanian.</i>

set	Put or set seeds seedlings or plants into the ground. Set the table.
set out	Fix in a border.
set to rights	Make ready or suitable or equip in advance for a particular purpose or for some use, event, etc.
set up	Urge to attack someone.
sort	Look at (a group of things) one after another in order to classify them or make a selection. <i>They agreed she could stay with them while she got herself sorted.</i>
sort out	Examine in order to test suitability.
spread out	Spread out or open from a closed or folded state.
stage	Perform a play especially on a stage. <i>UDF supporters staged a demonstration in Sofia.</i>
straighten out	Straighten by unrolling.
systematize	Arrange according to an organized system; make systematic. Systematize our scientific knowledge.
tidy	Bring order to (something); arrange neatly. <i>She paused briefly to tidy her hair.</i>
tidy up	Put (things or places) in order.

- *The quarrel, partly by the interference of the Crown Prince, was arranged.*
- *They arranged to meet at eleven o'clock.*
- *Can you arrange a meeting with the President?*
- *I arranged with my boss to have the time off.*
- *She had just finished arranging the flowers.*
- *My aunt arranged for the furniture to be stored.*
- *Songs arranged for viola and piano.*
- *The columns are arranged in 12 rows.*
- *Arrange my schedule.*
- *Accommodation can be arranged if required.*
- *They hoped to arrange a meeting.*



Associations of "Arrange" (30 Words)

align	Align oneself with a group or a way of thinking. <i>Newspapers usually align themselves with certain political parties.</i>
arranged	Deliberately arranged for effect. <i>An arranged marriage.</i>
array	A list of jurors impanelled. <i>He was clothed in fine array.</i>
battalion	An army unit usually consisting of a headquarters and three or more companies. <i>A battalion of ants.</i>
brigade	Form into a brigade. <i>They thought the speech too closely brigaded with illegal action.</i>
cleanup	A very large profit.

<u>codify</u>	Arrange according to a plan or system. <i>This would codify existing intergovernmental cooperation on drugs.</i>
configure	Arrange or put together in a particular form or configuration. <i>The memory can be configured as a virtual drive.</i>
coordinate	Form a coordinate bond to an atom or molecule. <i>You will coordinate with consultants and other departments on a variety of projects.</i>
deploy	To distribute systematically or strategically. <i>The air force began to deploy forward.</i>
deployment	The distribution of forces in preparation for battle or work. <i>A world leader in the development and deployment of wave and tidal power.</i>
establish	Institute enact or establish. <i>The trompe l'oeil illusion establishes depth.</i>
<u>format</u>	The organization of information according to preset specifications usually for computer processing. <i>The conventional format of TV situation comedies.</i>
institute	Begin (legal proceedings) in a court. <i>A testator who has instituted his daughter heir.</i>
<u>orchestrate</u>	Plan or coordinate the elements of (a situation) to produce a desired effect, especially surreptitiously. <i>The situation has been orchestrated by a tiny minority.</i>
orchestration	An arrangement of a piece of music for performance by an orchestra or band. <i>The skillful orchestration of his political campaign.</i>
ordered	Having a systematic arrangement; especially having elements succeeding in order according to rule. <i>An ordered sequence.</i>
ordering	Logical or comprehensible arrangement of separate elements. <i>There were mistakes in the ordering of items on the list.</i>
organization	The way in which the elements of a whole are arranged. <i>His compulsive organization was not an endearing quality.</i>
<u>organize</u>	Arrange systematically; order. <i>The soul doth organize the body.</i>
<u>prepare</u>	To prepare verbally either for written or spoken delivery. <i>The prince was prepared to become King one day.</i>
prepared	Equipped or prepared with necessary intellectual resources. <i>Be prepared for emergencies.</i>

ready	Make ready or suitable or equip in advance for a particular purpose or for some use event etc. <i>Get the children ready for school.</i>
redefine	Define again or differently. <i>She redefined his duties.</i>
relocation	The action of moving to a new place and establishing one's home or business there. <i>The planned relocation of national headquarters to Warwickshire.</i>
reorganize	Organize anew, as after a setback. <i>The company reorganized into fewer key areas.</i>
setup	An act that incriminates someone on a false charge. <i>It takes time to learn the setup around here.</i>
sizing	Any glutinous material used to fill pores in surfaces or to stiffen fabrics.
systematize	Arrange according to a system or reduce to a system. <i>Systematize our scientific knowledge.</i>
treat	Subject to a process or treatment with the aim of readying for some purpose improving or remedying a condition. <i>The lawns were treated with weedkiller every year.</i>
