affects the total amount you owe.

**annuitant** The recipient of an annuity.

The process of preparing or sending invoices.

**cash** Exchange for cash.

She was always short of **cash**.

default Declare a party to have defaulted and give judgement against that party.

The company will have to restructure its debts to avoid **default**.

deposit

The natural process of laying down a deposit of something.

Beds where salt is **deposit**ed by the tide.

**disbursement** The act of spending or disbursing money.

The bill includes unpaid professional **disbursement**s.

expenditure

Money paid out; an amount spent.

*Work is the expenditure of energy.* 

**expense**Offset an item of expenditure as an expense against taxable income.

His hotel and travel **expense**s.

fee An interest in land capable of being inherited.

Tuition **fee**s have now reached 9000 a year.

**financing** The act of financing.

**honorarium** A payment given for professional services that are rendered nominally

without charge.

inclusive Including the limits specified.

This is a testament to the **inclusive** environment fostered at our school.

**installment** A part of a broadcast serial.



mortgage A deed effecting a mortgage.

The estate was **mortgage**d up to the hilt.

**overdue** Having been needed for some time.

I was already a week and a half **overdue**.

**Payment**A sum of money paid or a claim discharged.
Three interest free monthly payments.

**rates** A local tax on property (usually used in the plural.

Restitution made or punishment inflicted for a wrong or injury.

recompense

He was recompensed for the wasted time.

refund Pay back money to.

I ll **refund** you for the apples and any other damage.

**reimbursement** The action of repaying a person who has spent or lost money.

He received **reimbursement** for his travel expenses.

remuneration Something that remunerates.

Adequate **remuneration** for his work.

rent Hold under a lease or rental agreement of goods and services.

Skis or snowboards **rent** for 60 80 for six days.

Something done or paid in expiation of a wrong.

**reparation** The courts required a convicted offender to make financial **reparation** to

his victim.

**requital** An act of requiting; returning in kind.

**restitution** The restoration of something to its original state.

The ANC had demanded the **restitution** of land seized from black people.

Pay a salary to.

He received a **salary** of 24 000.

tenant Occupy as a tenant.

Council house tenants.

unpaid Without payment.

**Unpaid** labour in the home.
