Someone who arrives (or has arrived).

### **birth**

The process of giving birth.

Someone with a promising future.

<b>coming</b>	The temporal property of becoming nearer in time. <i>The <b>coming</b> of a new age.</i>
<b>dawn</b>	The first light of day. <i>It was the <b>dawn</b> of the Roman Empire.</i>
<b>development</b>	The act of making some area of land or water more profitable or productive or useful. <i>The <b>development</b> of his ideas took many years.</i>
<u><a href="#">emergence</a></u>	The act of emerging. <i>I misjudged the timing of my <b>emergence</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">entrance</a></u>	The coming of an actor or performer on to a stage. <i>An <b>entrance</b> examination.</i>
<b>entrant</b>	One who enters a competition. <i>The prize will be awarded to the <b>entrant</b> who wins the tiebreak.</i>
<b>entry</b>	The action of taking up the legal right to property. <i>The <b>entry</b> to a block of flats.</i>
<b>first appearance</b>	The lowest forward gear ratio in the gear box of a motor vehicle; used to start a car moving.
<b>inauguration</b>	The ceremonial induction into a position. <i>The <b>inauguration</b> of the Modern Art Museum.</i>
<b>incomer</b>	A person who has come to live in an area in which they have not grown up, especially in a close-knit rural community. <i>An English <b>incomer</b> to Orkney.</i>
<b>materialization</b>	An appearance in bodily form (as of a disembodied spirit). <i>The <b>materialization</b> of her dream.</i>
<u><a href="#">newcomer</a></u>	A novice in a particular activity or situation. <i>Hill one of England's relative <b>newcomers</b> gave them the lead.</i>
<u><a href="#">occurrence</a></u>	An event that happens. <i>The <b>occurrence</b> of natural gas fields.</i>
<u><a href="#">onset</a></u>	The beginning of something, especially something unpleasant. <i>Early <b>onset</b> Alzheimer's disease.</i>
<u><a href="#">origin</a></u>	A person's social background or ancestry. <i>The terminology has its <b>origins</b> in America.</i>
<b>reaching</b>	The act of physically reaching or thrusting out.
<b>rise</b>	The property possessed by a slope or surface that rises. <i>Few models have had such a meteoric <b>rise</b>.</i>
<b>springing up</b>	The elasticity of something that can be stretched and returns to its original length.

<b>start</b>	A line indicating the location of the start of a race or a game. <i>He had a ninety minute <b>start</b> on them.</i>
<b>surfacing</b>	The outermost level of the land or sea.

- achieve** Successfully bring about or reach (a desired objective or result) by effort, skill, or courage.  
*She **achieved** her goal despite setbacks.*
- area** The extent or measurement of a surface or piece of land.  
*It was his **area** of specialization.*
- arrive** Reach a destination arrive by movement or progress.  
*After he published his book he had **arrived**.*
- attain** Reach a destination, either real or abstract.  
*Clarify your objectives and ways of **attaining** them.*
- bedside** Space by the side of a bed (especially the bed of a sick or dying person).  
*The doctor stood at her **bedside**.*

<b>bye</b>	A run scored from a ball that passes the batsman without being hit (recorded as an extra, not credited to the individual batsman). <i>He has a <b>bye</b> into the second round.</i>
<b>come</b>	Come from be connected by a relationship of blood for example. <i>The letter hasn't <b>come</b> yet.</i>
<b>comer</b>	A person who arrives somewhere. <i>Many in the party see tax relief as a <b>comer</b>.</i>
<b>distal</b>	Situated away from the centre of the body or from the point of attachment. <i>The <b>distal</b> end of the tibia.</i>
<b>end</b>	The state of affairs that a plan is intended to achieve and that when achieved terminates behavior intended to achieve it. <i>The <b>end</b> house.</i>
<b>eventually</b>	In the end, especially after a long delay, dispute, or series of problems. <i><b>Eventually</b> after midnight I arrived at the hotel.</i>
<u><a href="#">expanse</a></u>	A wide scope. <i>The green <b>expanse</b> of the forest.</i>
<u><a href="#">far</a></u>	At or to a certain point or degree. <i>A <b>far</b> trek.</i>
<b>finale</b>	The closing section of a musical composition. <i>The festival ends with a grand <b>finale</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">finally</a></u>	After an unspecified period of time or an especially long delay. <i>A referendum followed by local legislative and <b>finally</b> presidential elections.</i>
<b>finish</b>	Cause to finish a relationship with somebody. <i>Booze will be the <b>finish</b> of him.</i>
<b>get</b>	Take vengeance on or get even. <i>She didn't <b>get</b> the joke.</i>
<u><a href="#">here</a></u>	In or at this place where the speaker or writer is. <i><b>Here</b> is the money I promised you.</i>
<u><a href="#">influx</a></u>	An arrival or entry of large numbers of people or things. <i>The lakes are fed by <b>influxes</b> of meltwater.</i>
<b>landing</b>	The act of coming to land after a voyage. <i>We made a perfect <b>landing</b> at the airstrip.</i>
<b>locally</b>	With reference to a particular area or one's neighbourhood. <i>I shop <b>locally</b> wherever possible.</i>
<b>location</b>	A particular place or position. <i>The movie was filmed entirely on <b>location</b>.</i>

<b>near</b>	Nearly. <i><b>Near</b> beer.</i>
<b>nearby</b>	Not far away; close. <i>He slung his jacket over a <b>nearby</b> chair.</i>
<b>promising</b>	Showing signs of future success. <i>A <b>promising</b> start to the season.</i>
<b>reach</b>	An act of reaching out with one's arm. <i>He told a story to illustrate the <b>reach</b> of his fame.</i>
<b>scope</b>	Set the scope of a projected undertaking. <i>They <b>scoped</b> out their market.</i>
<b>station</b>	The frequency assigned to a broadcasting station. <i>Troops were <b>stationed</b> in the town.</i>
<b>ultimately</b>	Finally; in the end. <i><b>Ultimately</b> he had to give in.</i>
